



Foreword




Dedication


Senions









Prep Debaters Lose to Lovola of Baltimore

700 Attend Formal Opening of New Hall

On March 22, the Senior Debating Society held its first home debate of the current season. The debating team of Loyola High School furnished the opposition. The debate was staged in the new auditorium. The occasion was in-deed noteworthy. Over seven hundred friends and supporters of the Prep were present in spite of the inclement weather The numbers and animation of the spectators were indicative of the interest which the debate had aroused. It was a fitting event for the opening of the new hall.

The subject of the dehate was, "Resolved: That the Cabinet form of gov ernment is preferable to the Presidential or Three-department form of government." Our boys defended the negative

After numbers by the Glee Club and Orchestra, Mr. Shaughnessy, the chairman of the debate, welcomed the team from Baltimore in the name of Brooklyn Prep, and then explained the question to the audience.

The affirmative side of the discussion, or the superiority of the Cabinet form of government, was defended by the debaters of Loyola High School, Messrs. Kernan, Power, and Ireton; the negative view-point was upheld by Messrs. Ward, Tiernan, and Crane.

The first speaker for the affirmative was Mr. Gerald J. Kernan, a master of eloquence and logic. He introduced the debate by showing that the argument dealt, not with the English form of government as opposed to the American form, but with a consideration of the respective qualifications of the cabinet form of government and the presidential system. He showed that the presidential form of government repels men of ability; that, under the presidential form, there exists antagonism between the Congress and the Executive. His-arguments were presented in a forceful-manner; he was fiery and eloquent.

The first speaker for the negative was Mr. Ward. He opened his attack with the question: "What is the purpose of all government? Is it not the protection
