


## Depot History

- Built in 1903, operated as train depot until 1973
- Building includes
  - 3,300 square foot (SF)
    First Floor with restrooms,
    ticketing, baggage, waiting
    area, and ladies' waiting area
  - 900 SF step-down Express Room
  - 600 SF Partial Basement (Mechanical Room)
  - 500 SF Covered Breezeway

## Ownership

- April 1977 City acquires depot building and leases land from Atchison Topeka and Santa Fe RR
- October 1978 City leases depot and premises to the Pottawatomie County Historical Society (PCHS)
- September 1985 to September 1986
   City negotiates with Mr. White and purchases depot land
- January 1997 and July 1998 City renews lease agreement with PCHS



## Building Use

- 1904 to 1973 Used as a Rail Depot for 70 years
- 1982 to 2020 Operated as a Museum with railroad and Pottawatomie County historical artifacts
- 2021 Museum operations ceased and moved to the new "Paul and Ann Milburn Center"

- Building leased to Pottawatomie County for \$1/year (\$44 total revenue)
- City paid \$4,340 in utilities for the museum
- City paid \$5,720 in insurance while the building was a museum



## Building Use (cont'd)

- Current market value if fully renovated - (\$18/sf)
   \$75,600 per year
- If rented at fair market value by the City over 44 years, estimated revenue would have been \$1-1.2 million
- The City agreed to provide additional \$300,000 for the Paul and Ann Milburn Center between 2020 and 2024.

- Fall 2020/Spring 2021 GH2 Architects completed
  study (\$34,720) of building
  envelope and roof:
  - \$600,000 (in 2020 dollars) for the exterior repair (roof, doors, windows, and masonry)
  - Minimum of \$2 million needed when interior renovations are included




















  - Future Lease Spaces

  - Intermodal transit (bus, car, taxi, bicycle, streetcar)
  - Enhanced pedestrian access
