The Interrogation
19–22 July 2018

An art project in conjunction with Public Art Munich 2018 and X Shared Spaces. Produced by Münchner Kammerspiele in cooperation with PAM 2018.

The intelligence service of the Federal Republic of Germany is older than the Federal Republic itself. It was founded as the "Gehlen Organization" in 1946 under US control and consisted largely of former high-ranking Nazis. In 1956 it renamed itself the "Bundesnachrichtendienst" (BND). Federal Intelligence Service. In addition to its central offices in Munich-Fullach and Berlin, the BND operates around 200 secret offices worldwide, half of them in Germany. They have front names like "Federal Property Management Agency, Special Assets Division" and fulfill a wide variety of functions—from creating forged documents to conducting surveillance on journalists and setting up concealed radio stations, whose transmission and receiving systems are housed in significant places, such as the north bell tower of Munich's cathedral, the Frauenkirche.

The theatrical loop "The Interrogation" deals with the BND's office in the region. This series of workshops by the staging group consists of a reading of a selected text, an act out to them if they cooperate and provide information. The intelligence agency's practice of "siphoning" outposts was declared ended in 2015 under public pressure and the "Main Office of Interrogation" changed with it was closed. Since then, the interrogations have been carried out at other locations.

The performance does not reenact an actual interrogation, but simulates an exercise in a BND training context. The calculation of specific techniques, conducted here in exemplary fashion, is what makes it possible to internalize such actions in the cause of security. This performative situation—which on the surface appears to be the reenactment of a course of instruction and evokes its immersive moments—illustrates the impossibility of documentary truth content and politically new constellations of a fragmented reality. Participants are addressed and involved as agent trainees. They enter a narrative zone of intelligence codes and contemporary representations of citizenship, the welfare of the state, state secrets, and the sphere of personal privacy. At the end, they receive a "Secret Guide", a cartographic overview of the intelligence service's outposts in Munich, and are released with the assignment of reviewing them for the next class.

In a BND interrogation an asylum seeker said that Iraq was developing biological weapons. His statements were false but relevant in terms of intelligence. The BND passed the information along to the US, which used it in 2003 as grounds for attacking Iraq. The asylum seeker was given the codename Curveball and worked at the ad agency Thiele und Friedrichs Marketing GbR, a front company of the BND.

The weather instruments in front of the building are fenced in like a compound. Behind the reflective façades are several offices of the BND. The "Federal Property Management Division, Special Assets" is one of the main covers of BND employees, which they also report as their employer to the tax office. The "Garner Foundation" finances recruited students and assists apprehended BND employees. The "Medical and Social Service for Federal Agencies" treats incapacitated agents. The "Military District Administration South – Branch Office Munich" is presumably a main office of the Military Counterintelligence Service. The "Office for Foreign Issues" is an outpost whose directorate was connected around the year 2000 to language recognition projects (SENSUS software for Europol).

Frauenplatz 12 | from before the fall of the Berlin Wall (1989) to the present (2018)

The surveillance commando QB30 of the BND operates two disguised radio stations with the cover names Saturn and Mercury. The radio relay stations are housed in the northern bell tower of Munich's Frauenkirche. An official inquiry into this matter by Public Art Munich was answered by the press office of the archdiocesan chancery on 2 March 2018: "Nothing about an entity named QB30 of the BND is known to us."

The CIA listed Gloria Film Distributor as a front company of the German Intelligence Service (Org). Gloria's domestic films, like the series "08/15" ran successfully until they were eclipsed by the New German Cinema. The Gloria Film Palace is located across from the Palace of Justice.

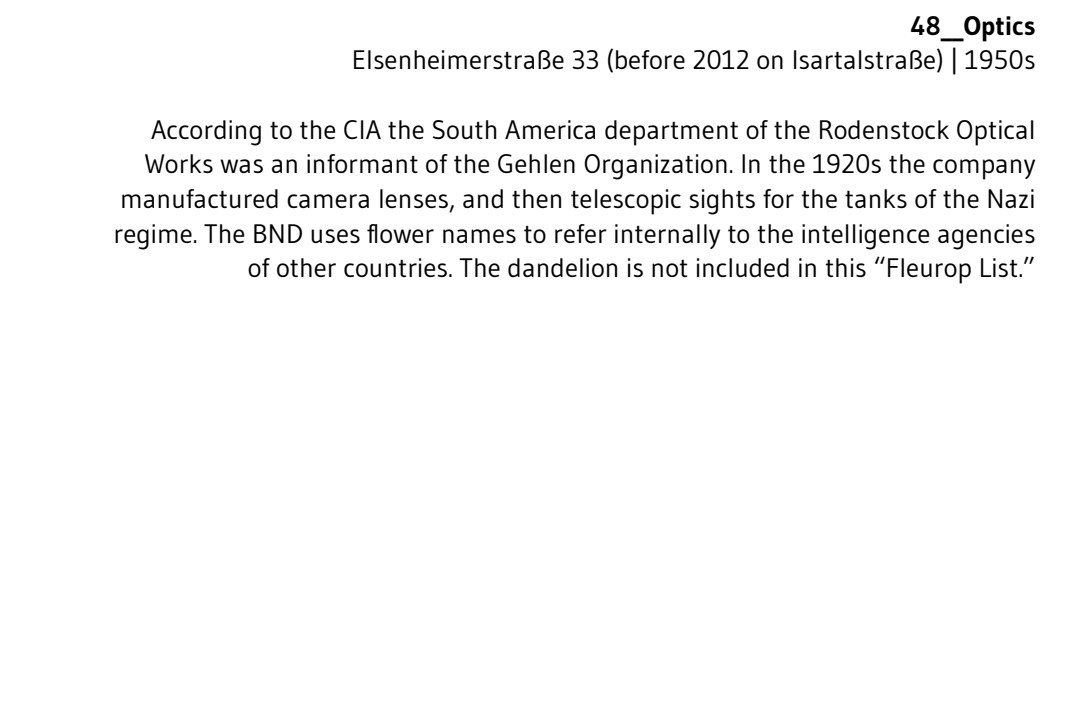
The surveillance commando QB30 of the BND has thus far conducted surveillance on diplomats, agents, and journalists. Facilities of the Military Counterintelligence Service (German: Militärischer Abschirmdienst: MAD) are located in the same complex.



80_Public Relations

Nymphenburger Straße 160 | presumably 1960s to 1972

To influence public perception the BND established special relationships to journalists. A list from the 1970s registers 230 media contacts, who were taken care of by 35 employees of the department of press management. In 1972 the BND dissolved the secret department to set up an official press office.

Eisenheimerstraße 33 (before 2012 on Isartalstraße) | 1950s

According to the CIA the South America department of the Rodenstock Optical Works was an informant of the Gehlen Organization. In the 1920s the company manufactured camera lenses, and then telescopic sights for the tanks of the Nazi regime. The BND uses flower names to refer internally to the intelligence agencies of other countries. The dandelion is not included in this "Fleurop List."

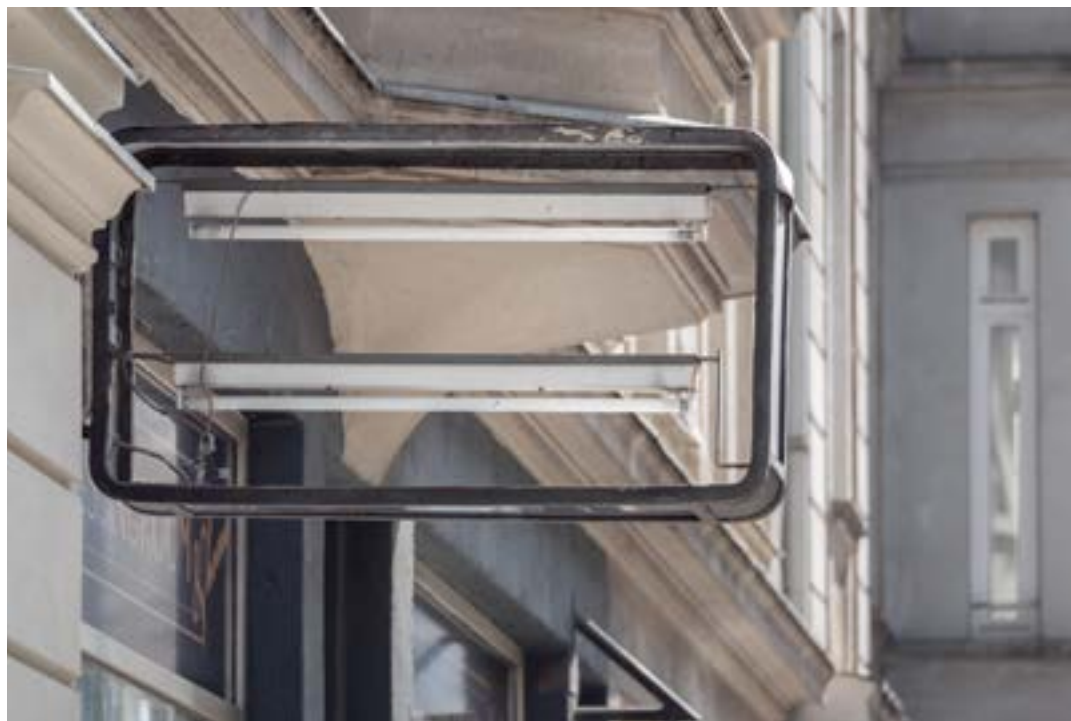
The Academy Bookstore did not sell books. It was a bogus company of the German Intelligence Service (Org). The company's close physical proximity to the art academy, and the art academy's remoteness at the time from theory, ensured that the code name "Akademie Buchhandlung" was difficult to crack.



20_ Theatrical Performance

Eisenheimer Str. 21 | 1971 to 1981

Heidrun Hofer fell in love with Hans Puschke in Paris. He introduced himself to the radical right-wing BND secretary as a member of the die-hard Nazi organization "Überlebensträger." She disclosed BND secrets to him about NATO operations. "Hans Puschke" was a Russian "Romeo" agent and the die-hard Nazi organization "Überlebensträger" with its main office in South America was an invention of the KGB. Heidrun Hofer also made the acquaintance of the Überlebensträger chairman "Baron von Hohenstein." The KGB agent Juri Drosdow, who was passing himself off as the Baron, had taken acting lessons for the role at the Max Reinhardt Seminar.

Outpost—interrogation sources, e.g. asylum seekers (Quellen des Spionageversens)

Siphoning—information through a source

Recursive Interrogation—a source's extant information is siphoned directly

Operative Interrogation—a source updates their level of knowledge through travel and/or meeting with additional persons and is then siphoned

Dislocation—distributing offices with various functions throughout the urban area

Front company—an actual company whose structures are used by intelligence services

Bogus company—a company facade constructed to disguise intelligence activities, behind which no real company exists

Org—abbreviation for Gehlen Organization (founded in 1946, renamed Bundesnachrichtendienst [Federal Intelligence Service] in 1956)

The names of the bogus companies of Org usually started with the letters S and T. The intelligence agency's contact man in the Munich administration, who entered the companies into the Trade register, was responsible only for these two letters, so that the choice of names remained limited.
