



Dear students,

The assessment of the ongoing pandemic at the OVGU is based on a gradual plan. We are currently in stage 1 and thus in the restricted regular operation. Therefore, we would like to inform you on behalf of our faculty about the basic regulations during the upcoming examination phase of the summer semester 2022.

Overall regulations¹

With the aim of competence-oriented, module-specific assessments, the FEM will hold a number of in-person examinations on the one hand, and a large number of online examinations on the other. You will be informed continuously and in due time (at least 14 days before the examination) about a change in the type/form of examination depending on the pandemic situation or the legal or statutory situation, among other things, by means of the "[hybrid examination schedule of the FEM](#)". You can also find this on the homepage of the Examinations Office.

We would also like to point out the following:

- (1) If a student does not take part in a registered module examination, this is considered a withdrawal from the examination. The examination will not be graded as "insufficient (5.0)". The submission of proof, e.g. a medical certificate, is not required.
- (2) In deviation from (1), however, it is necessary in the case of an *oral or practical examination* that you *declare your withdrawal* in written form to the examiners via the student e-mail address at the latest on the day before the examination date.

(3) Any module examination/examination that *has been taken* and is assessed as "insufficient (5.0)" by the examiners or ex officio due to an attempted deception will also be assessed in the same way (as "not passed") and will be included in your overall grade overview.

In-person examinations

- *The permanent wearing of a mouth-nose protection* (medical mask/FFP2 mask) immediately before/after and during the examination **is strongly recommended** for every examinee.
- *Keeping a minimum distance of 1.50 m* from other fellow examinees is strongly recommended before/after the examination and whenever possible.
- For the purpose of verification of identity, an official photo ID (identity card, passport), if necessary in conjunction with your student ID, must be presented.
- If it is de facto impossible for you – through no fault of your own – to take part in a scheduled attendance examination (e.g. due to a quarantine ordered by the authorities), you can apply for a change of examination type/form up to and including 08 July 2022.

Online Examinations

FEM will conduct online examinations either in the format of an *oral examination* or as an *unsupervised written assignment*.

In order to take the online exams properly, you will need access to a stable, high-capacity internet connection. If you can credibly demonstrate that you do not have such access (e.g. if you live in a place without broadband), you have the option of taking the scheduled online examination (→ no change to the in-person examination!) in a WiFi-equipped examination room at the OVGU.



In this case, the **hardware required** for the online examination (e.g. laptop, camera, microphone) must be **provided by you as the examinee**. An application for a room must be submitted to the FEM Examination Office **no later than *two weeks* before the respective examination** (cut-off deadline).

Furthermore, we would like to point out the following for online examinations:

- To check your identity, especially for oral examinations, you must have an official photo ID (identity card, passport), if necessary in conjunction with your student ID.
- For oral examinations, you will also need a webcam and a high-quality microphone connected to your computer.
- „Written assignments" are (if applicable) carried out within the framework of the respective e-learning course, but, as with other types/forms of examinations, require the timely registration for the examination in advance.
- In the event of a **credible, non-culpable** loss of connection or technical problems during an online examination, it is usually possible to retake the examination attempt on the next examination date (in the next semester). In justified exceptional cases, the examiner can also immediately continue or reschedule the examination in the event of short-term disruptions.
- **Detailed questions** regarding preparation (if necessary, coordination of dates for oral examinations), the procedure and the conduct of the online examination must be clarified in advance with the respective module supervisor in person. The Examinations Office should not be contacted for these matters.
