



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GENERAL CODES OF CONDUCT

- All clients must register at Reserve gate upon entry and exit.
- Briefing is mandatory to all visitors before commencement of the activities.
- Permit once issued is valid for 24 hours of the permit date.
- Reserve gate opens at 06:00.am and closes at 06:00p.m. Unless camping overnight or conducting night game drive, vacate the Reserve before 6.00 p.m.
- Don't feed the animals, it upsets their diet and leads to human dependence.
- Keep to a minimum distance of 50 meters when viewing animals in vehicle.
- Leave no litter on the trails. For camping and picnicking guest clean and remove all trash from your site.
- Do not pick, cut or destroy any vegetation or remove any object of biological interest, including eggs, bones and feathers.
- Do not smoke while on tourism activities. Burning cigarette can start a wild fire that would cause damage to vegetation and suffering to wildlife and people.
- Smoking is only allowed at designated areas.
- Keep quiet, noise disturbs the wildlife and may antagonize your fellow visitors.
- Do not light or cause fire to be lit.
- Do not toss items to pull animals closer.
- Visitors who require medical attention should carry their emergency medical information cards.
- The tour operator must have reliable communication devices and first aid kit.
- Secure all your food and Belongings for the wild animals.
- Fees for activity shall be in accordance to Reserve's tariffs.
- Clients shall pay applicable fee through Bank or mobile before conducting the activity
- Fees once paid are non-refundable
- Use public washroom facilities all the time unless you have private mobile ones
- Visitors under the influence of alcohol or illicit drugs are not allowed

FOR CYCLISTS

- Required to wear safety equipment including whistle, a properly fitting helmet and protective glasses.
- Children of 10 to 12 years will only be allowed if they are accompanied by adult.
- Children below 10 years are not allowed.
- Only one person per bicycle will be allowed.
- Non-motorized bicycle shall be used for the activity.
- Ensure your bike is safe to ride.
- Know your physical limits and choose your route carefully.
- Use hand signals to let motorists know what you will be doing next.
- Wear dim-colored and low-visibility clothing.
- A trip cover 01 – 06 visitors.



FOR WALKING

- Follow on designated trails only.
- All safaris must be accompanied by armed rangers.
- All visitors must fill in and sign indemnity forms prior to conducting the activity
- All walks will always be conducted in a single line.
- A trip will cover 01 – 6 visitors
- Wear dim-colored and Low – visibility clothing.
- Children below eighteen years are not allowed



FOR PICNIC & CAMPING

- Camping and picnicking is only allowed in designated areas.
- All wheeled vehicles and trailers must be kept on parking areas.
- Excessive volume on radios or other musical instruments are not permitted. Shutdown of these items will be appreciated.
- Please remove all trash from camp and picnic site.
- Campfires are the responsibility of the camper and are restricted to fire rings.
- Extinguish your fire carefully before leaving the camp and picnic site.
- Zip up your tent to avoid anything coming in unwillingly.
- Don't walk about at night.
- Don't take food to your tent or leave anything outside your tent.



FOR BIRD WATCHING

NOT mimic the calls of birds as this will disturb them.

- Review of this code of conduct shall be carried out regularly as may deem necessary
- Inform us in advance your travel plan so that we organize payment in advance to avoid unnecessary inconvenience.

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ABOUT KIJERESHI

Nestled within the Western Serengeti ecosystem, Kijereshi Game Reserve spans 66 kilometre square of vibrant open plains. Recognized as a conservation haven on June 10, 1994, the reserve's allure lies in its rich array of resident wildlife and varied indigenous forests and grasslands.

A pivotal segment of the Great Migration's Western Corridor, Kijereshi witnesses a breathtaking spectacle from May to August: a colossal procession of approximately 2 million wildebeest and their offspring surging through the landscape in quest of nourishing pastures.

This awe-inspiring event represents the planet's most significant animal migration. As these herds conclude their Tanzanian journey, Kijereshi serves as their turning point before embarking on the Kenyan leg, only to retrace their steps back through the Serengeti National Park following the arid season. Positioned in Simiyu's Busega and Bariadi districts, the reserve's boundaries interlace with the Serengeti National Park, Lukungu, and several villages, forging a sanctuary of natural wonder.



WHY KIJERESHI?

- Thrilling natural environment and superb facilities of Kijereshi offer exceptional opportunities for visitors to feasibly explore attractions to their satisfaction.
- With its manageable size, Kijereshi can be covered in a short time, perfect for people on tight schedules.
- Conveniently located near airports/airstrips offering an opportunity to visit for travellers in transit.
- Opportunity to visit other nearby attractions including Mwalimu Julius Kambarage Nyerere Museum at Butiama only 65km from the reserves entrance gate; the historical sites of the Ukerewe islands, about 117 km; proximity to the Sukuma people and opportunities to learn about the tribe's culture.

ACTIVITIES

- Game drives—bush and picnic meals included (hint: enjoy a Serengeti sunset and a night drive for an even more unforgettable experience)
- Guided nature walk—armed ranger service included
- Camping—(mobile, special and public) don't forget firewood for your bonfire
- Bird watching—some of the best in the world
- Commercial photography/filming—no entry fees for camera



ATTRACTIONS

- Many and varied wildlife including elephants, buffalo, lions, leopards, cheetah, giraffes, zebra, wildebeests, hyenas, elands, Thomson gazelle, topi, waterbuck, reedbuck, baboons, colobus monkey, and varieties of bird species including ostriches.
- Migratory herds of wildebeest, be sure to visit during calving season, and zebras from May to August depending on rain season.
- Beautiful landscapes characterized by open acacia woodlands, wide plains and endless skies ideal for viewing the reserve's wildlife.

HOW TO GET THERE?

The gate is east of Mwanza–Musoma road, between Lamadi (4km) and Bunda (19km) in Simiyu. Kijereshi is accessible by air through the Mwanza airport.

TOURIST FACILITIES

Inside the reserve, there are camping sites (special and public) and the Kijereshi Tented Camp at affordable prices for all visitors. Visitors may also seek accommodation from hotels and camps outside the reserve in Mwanza, Musoma, Bariadi, Lamadi and Bunda.

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

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

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
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ABOUT MPANGA-KIPENGERE



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

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ABOUT KILWA RUINS

Step into a captivating realm of enchantment at Kilwa Kisiwani and Songo Mnara. Located on the stunning shores of the Indian Ocean in Tanzania in Kilwa district of Lindi region, these historic sites, dating back to the 9th century, were once bustling trading hubs along the Swahili Coast, connecting Africa, Arabia, India, and China through the vast Indian Ocean trade network.

Inscribed as UNESCO World Heritage Sites in 1981 and Man and Biosphere Reserve in 2023, Kilwa Kisiwani and Songo Mnara are preserved as exceptional treasures of cultural heritage. Explore the Great Mosque, the oldest surviving mosque in East Africa, with its intricate details and exquisite carvings. Wander through the ruins of Songo Mnara, a once-thriving town, where remnants of palaces, and mosques tell stories of a bygone era.

Managed by the Tanzania Wildlife Management Authority, this site allows visitors to immerse themselves in the vibrant legacy of the Swahili Coast and experience a journey through time that will leave them in awe.

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
ABOUT SELOUS

Selous Game Reserve is Tanzania's largest Game Reserve, spanning over two regions in South-Eastern Tanzania, with an area of 18,020.54 square kilometres, and named after Captain Frederick Courtney Selous, an eminent naturalist, explorer, and hunter of the nineteenth century.

Selous is known for its spectacular river system, including the Rufiji, Matandu, and Njenje, and its diverse terrain dominated by Acacia savanna grasslands and Miombo woodlands.

The reserve harbours a myriad of wildlife species, including hippos, crocodiles, and different species of fish. It is home to Tanzania's largest concentration of elephants and a larger assemblage of carnivores, making it the stronghold for critically endangered wild dogs in Africa.

Due to its exceptional biodiversity and undisturbed state, Selous Game Reserve was designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1982 and remains one of Africa's premier hunting destinations, known for its quality trophies.



WHY SELOUS?

WILDLIFE

The Reserve is a popular destination for both hunting and photographic tourism due to its abundant large mammal populations, including the Big Four (elephant, lion, leopard, and buffalo), as well as hippos, wildebeest, zebra, impalas, sable antelope, hartebeest, wild dogs, hyenas, waterbuck, reedbuck, bushbuck and many other species.

BIRDLIFE

The Reserve has over 450 bird species – in 1 hour across the landscape one may be able to encounter over 50 Species of birds in average.

SCENERY

The Reserve offers spectacular natural views, including the beautiful Lung'onya flood plain and a network of rivers with stunning sandy beaches, such as the Rufiji and Matandu. Visitors can participate in sport fishing for tiger fish and observe various aquatic life in Lake Utunge, Kihurumila, and Luwimbi.

HISTORIC SITES

Historical Sites such as the Obasi and Chema inserberg that were used as battle ground during the First World War.
