Description

bbw University of Applied Science's **Aufbau programme** is a skilled-worker integration programme created for refugees from Syria, Iran, Iraq or Eretria holding a bachelor's degree from their home country.

At the conclusion of the eight-month programme held at the bbw campus in Berlin-Charlottenburg, participants will have acquired a solid understanding of:

- the German language
- Germanic work and insurance practices, CV preparation and job application procedures
- Workplace communication for qualified workers and academic applicants

In the final week of the programme, students are personally matched with HR representatives from Brandenburg firms seeking skilled employees with academic backgrounds.

Funding

The *Aufbau* programme is funded by the German Ministry of Education and Research as part of the DAAD's Integration Programme. It is therefore a free programme for refugees living in the Berlin-Brandenburg area who meet specific criteria and who are able to take part for the full duration of the programme.

Participation Criteria

The *Aufbau* programme is open to a strictly limited number of nationals from Syria, Iran, Iraq or Eretria. To apply for the programme, applicants will need to submit scanned copies of the following documents:

- University graduation certificate (originals & German or English translation)
- Final university grade sheet (originals & German or English translation)
- A copy of the German-issued "Aufenthaltserlaubnis Flucht" valid until at least 31.12.2019. Holders of the "Aufenthaltsgestattung" may also be considered in specific circumstances.

Selected applicants will be asked to attend a brief interview in English. Only seven candidates will be selected into the programme. If selected, participants will be asked to sign a written declaration confirming that they will be able to take part in the programme for its full duration.

Programme Content and Goal



1. 4th March to 21th May*

Basic Communication in German CEF-A1 - A2.2 (300 units @ 25 units per week)

2. 24th May to 21th June*

Orientation course:

German society and politics CEF-A2.2 to A2.3 (100 units @ 25 units per week)

3. 8th July to 25th October*

Integration course:

Business Communication in German CEF-B1 to B2 (400 units @ 25 units per week)

In the final week of the programme, the participants take part in a series of intensive workshops designed to integrate them into the German workforce.


