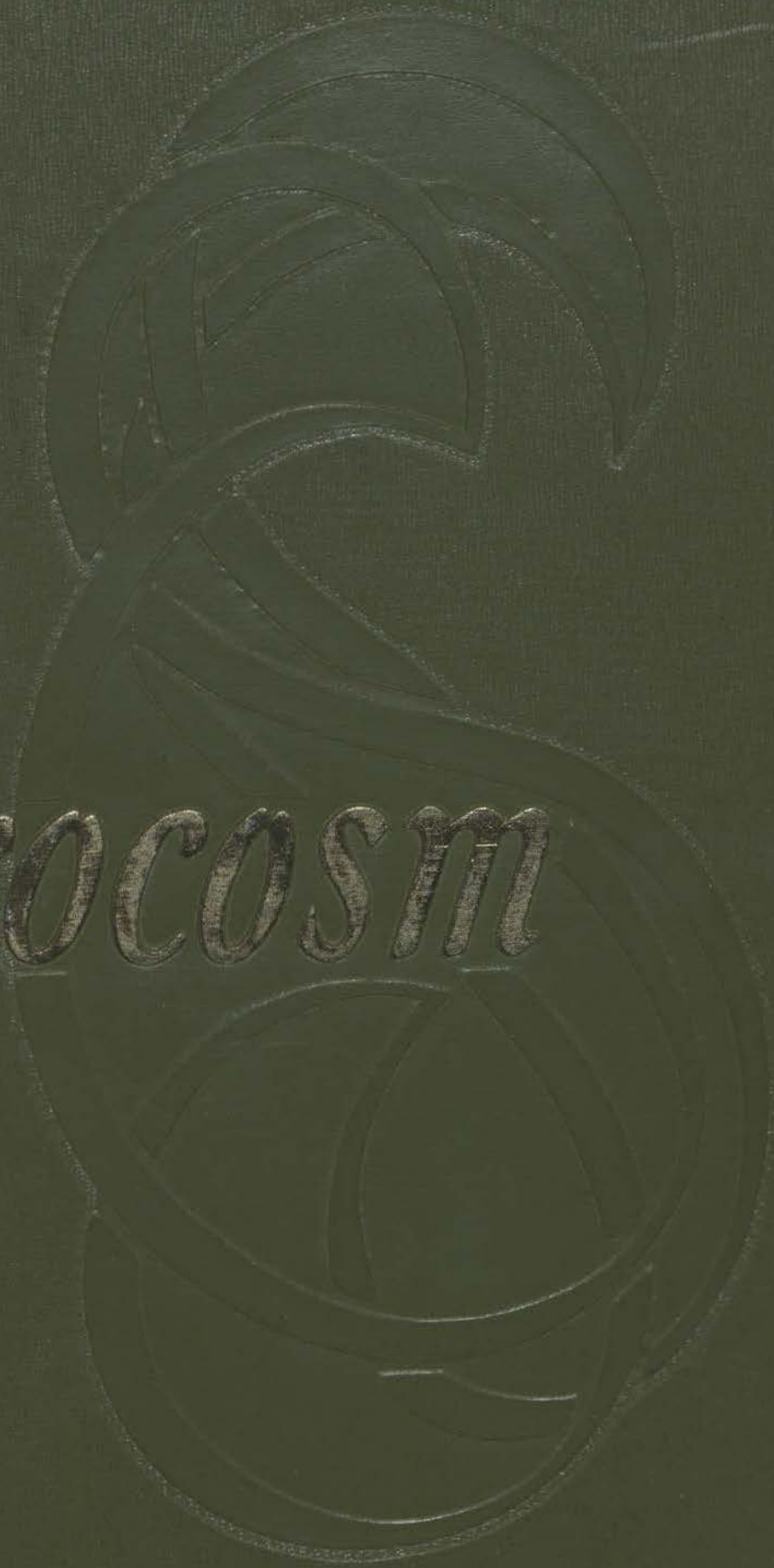

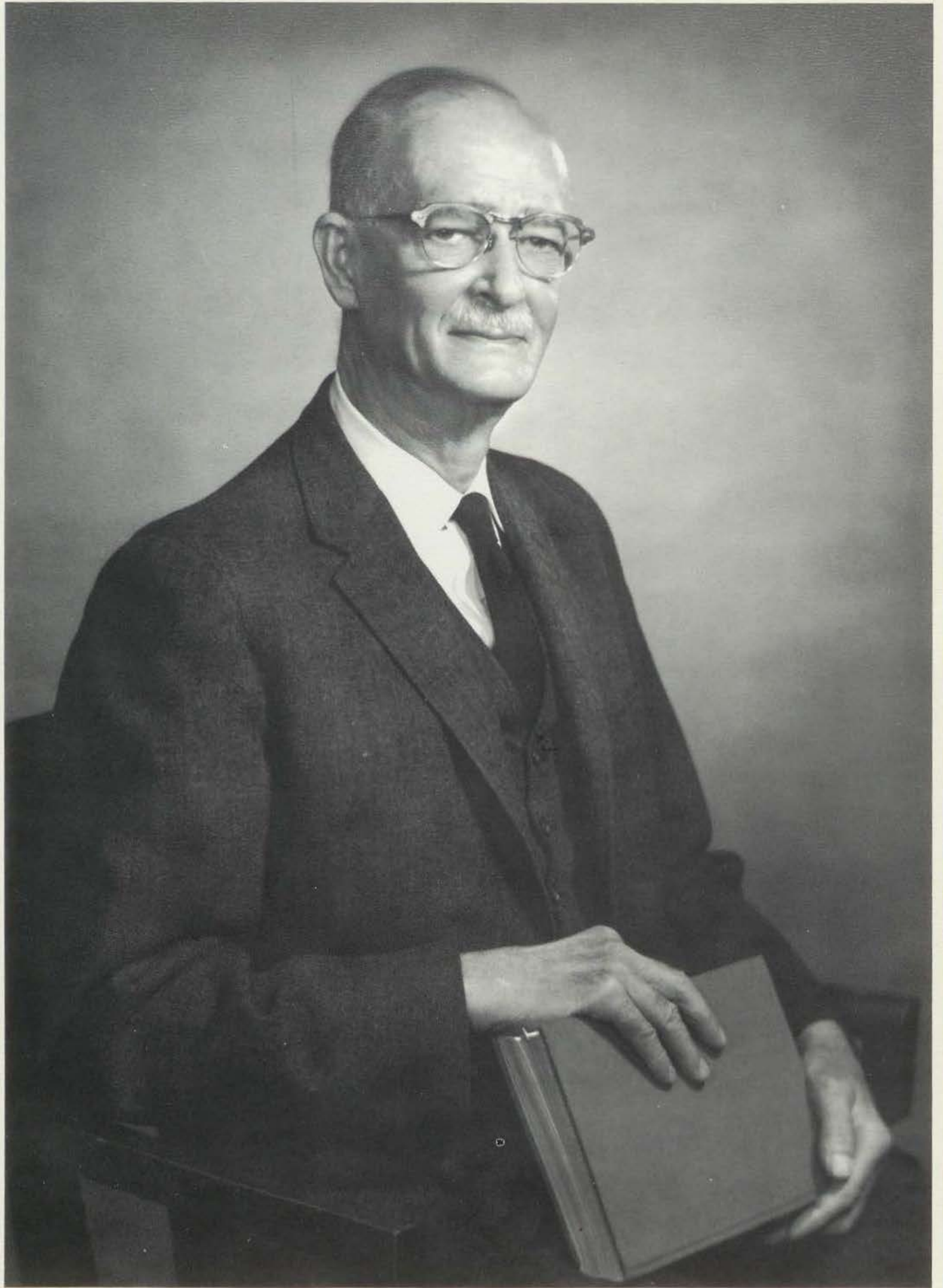

"I know him, I have seen him teach and I have seen the results of his teaching. I believe him to be one of the greatest teachers at Dickinson in my time."

In his forty-first year at Dickinson, Professor Ralph W. Schechter has built a reputation as one of the most versatile and inspiring of all Dickinson teachers. Few men have been able to enlighten so many fields as has Professor Schechter and the fondness in which he is held by his former students is evidenced by their constant inquiries and visits.

Since coming to Dickinson in 1922, he has enriched the lives of students in three fields: music, English, and public speaking. Schechter has so successfully combined a love of music with a love of teaching that his students refer to him as the "old Master" in both subjects.

Imaginative and forthright, Professor Schechter has contributed important advances to the College's educational program with his development of an audio-visual technique to simplify the task of reading music. He personally organized and directed the first College band and orchestra, and his outstanding work in English literature earned him an appointment to the Thomas Beaver Chair of English at Dickinson in 1958. The Beaver Chair is one of the oldest in the College's history.

It is to one of Dickinson's "Old Guard," a man whose teaching has inspired hundreds of men and women over the years, that the MICROCOSM dedicates its 1963 edition.

THE JOSEPH PRIESTLEY AWARD



Each year a special commemoration known as the Joseph Priestley Celebration is held at Dickinson College. At this time, the Dickinson College Award in Memory of Joseph Priestley, the Discoverer of Oxygen, is given to a distinguished scientist for his discoveries or for his contributions to the welfare of mankind. The Award is in the form of the Priestley Medallion, in ceramic, struck from the original moulds made in 1779 by Josiah Wedgwood after a pen sketch of Priestley drawn from life by John Flaxman in the same year.

This year's Priestley Award was presented to Dr. Kenneth S. Pitzer, President of Rice University. Author

of several books and numerous articles in the field of chemistry, he pioneered in the application of spectroscopic and statistical methods to the study of complex organic molecules and their reactions.

Dr. Pitzer has received numerous prizes and awards, including the American Chemical Society Award in Pure Chemistry in 1943, the U.S. Junior Chamber of Commerce Award as one of the ten outstanding young men in the nation in 1950, and a Guggenheim Fellowship in 1951. Dickinson College is proud to recognize one of the outstanding scientists of our age.

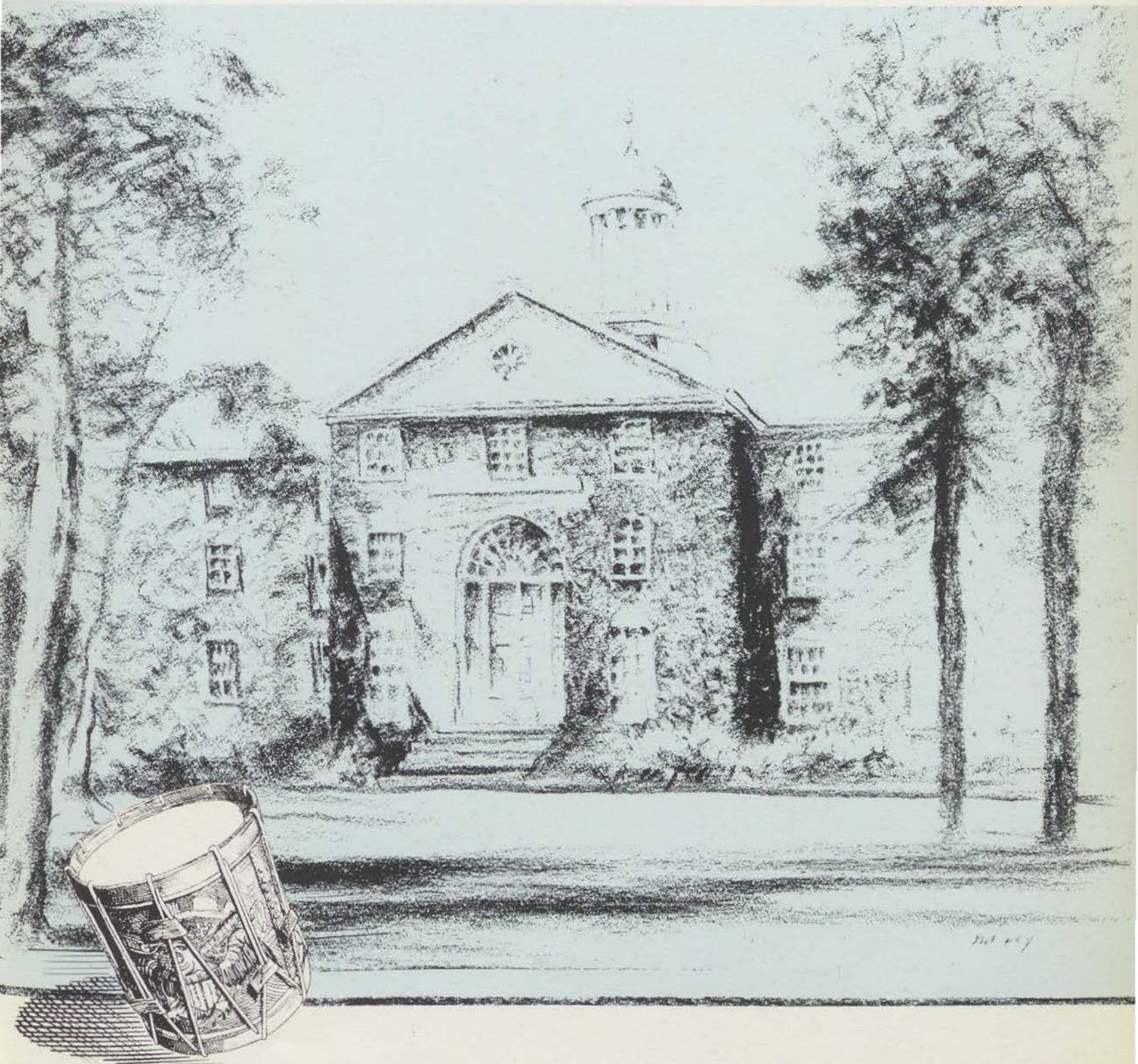
"OLD WEST" NAMED AN HISTORIC SITE

The historic vine-covered "Old West" was designated a national historic landmark by Secretary of the Interior, Steward L. Udall.

"Old West," main building of the Dickinson campus, was built in 1804. It was designed by Benjamin Latrobe, the most famous architect of his day, who was the designer of the Capitol at Washington. Years later he wrote that only three buildings he had constructed in his life

gave him satisfaction, and he named "Old West" among the three.

In a striking example of educational philanthropy worthy of emulation by all generations, Latrobe gave the plans of the stately structure without cost as his contribution to the new-found college of the early American frontier.



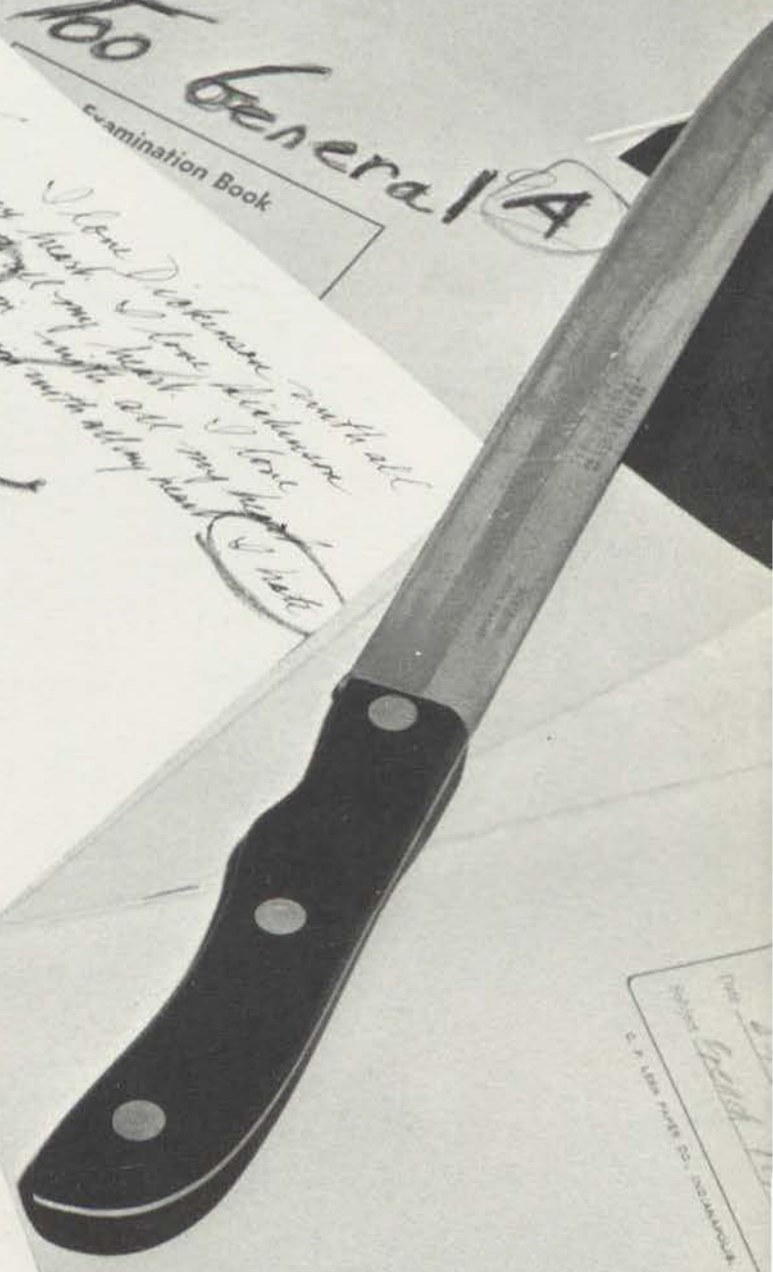

This year, ODK has instituted a scholarship fund, a further contribution of importance this organization has given to Dickinson College.

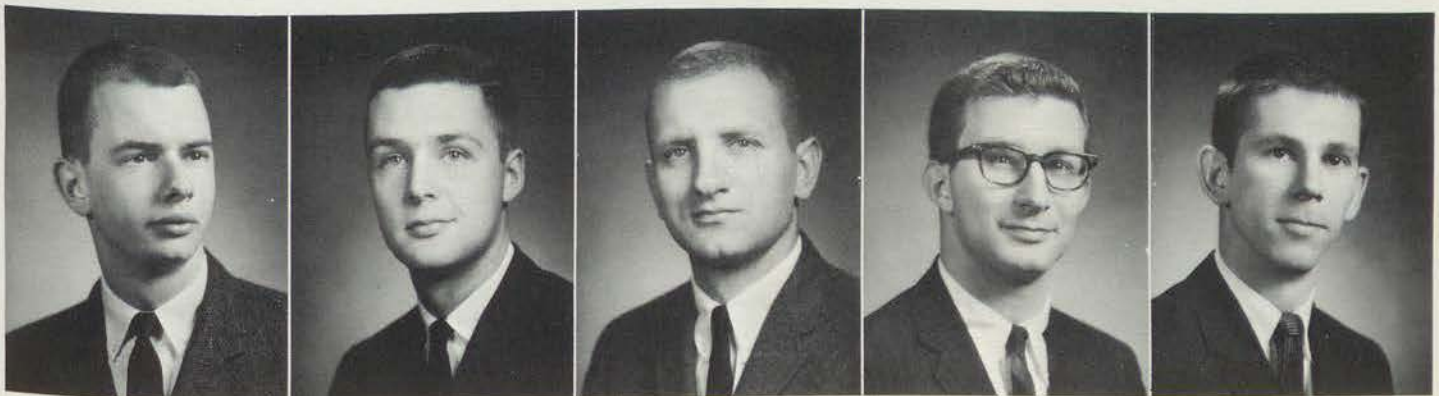

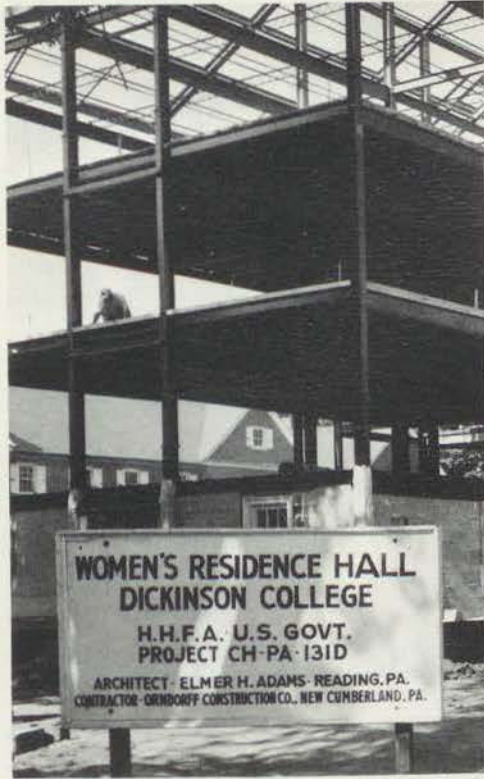

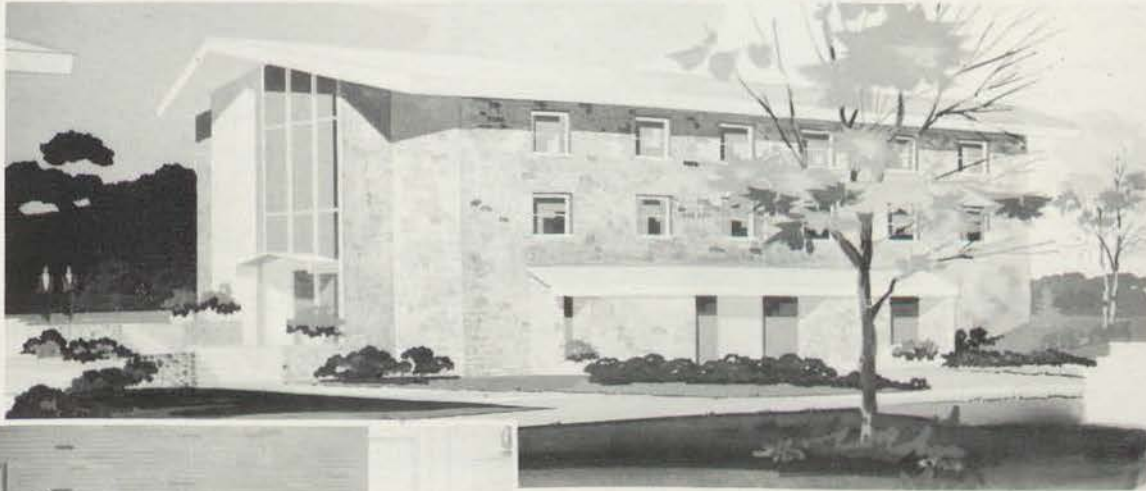

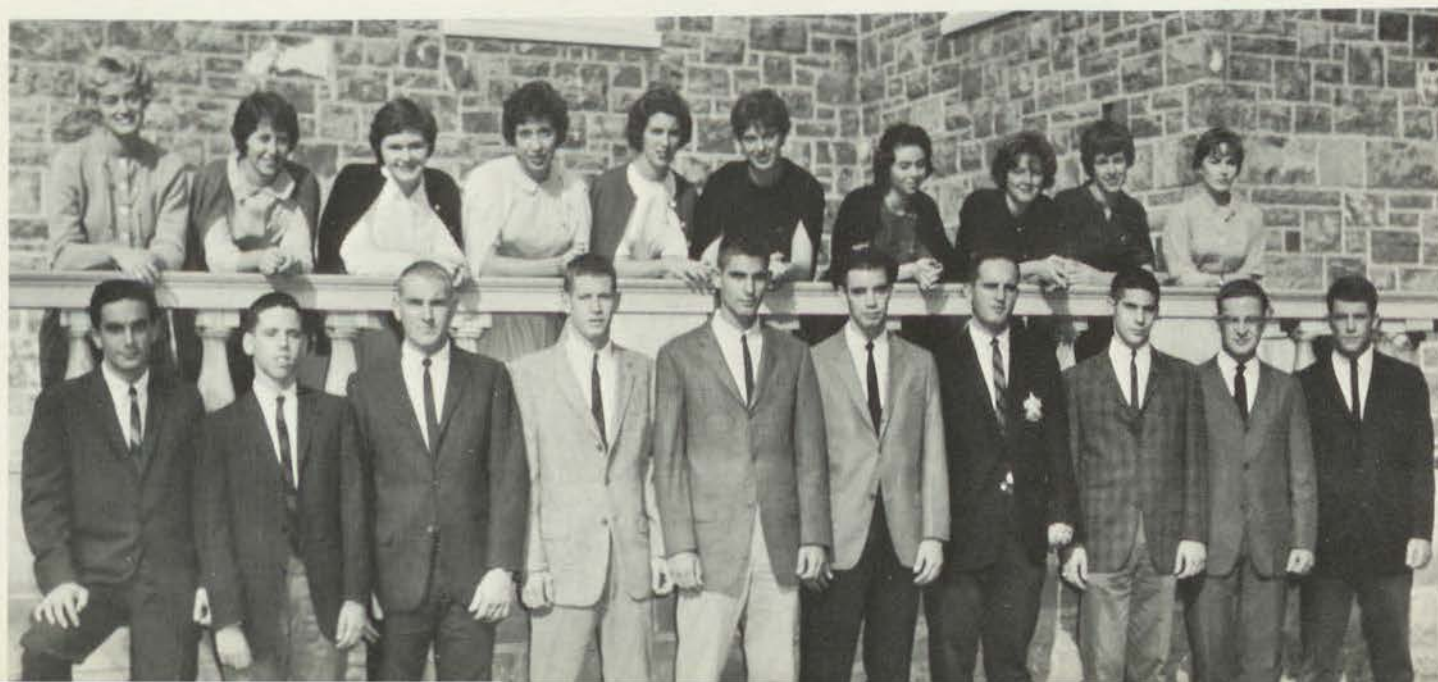

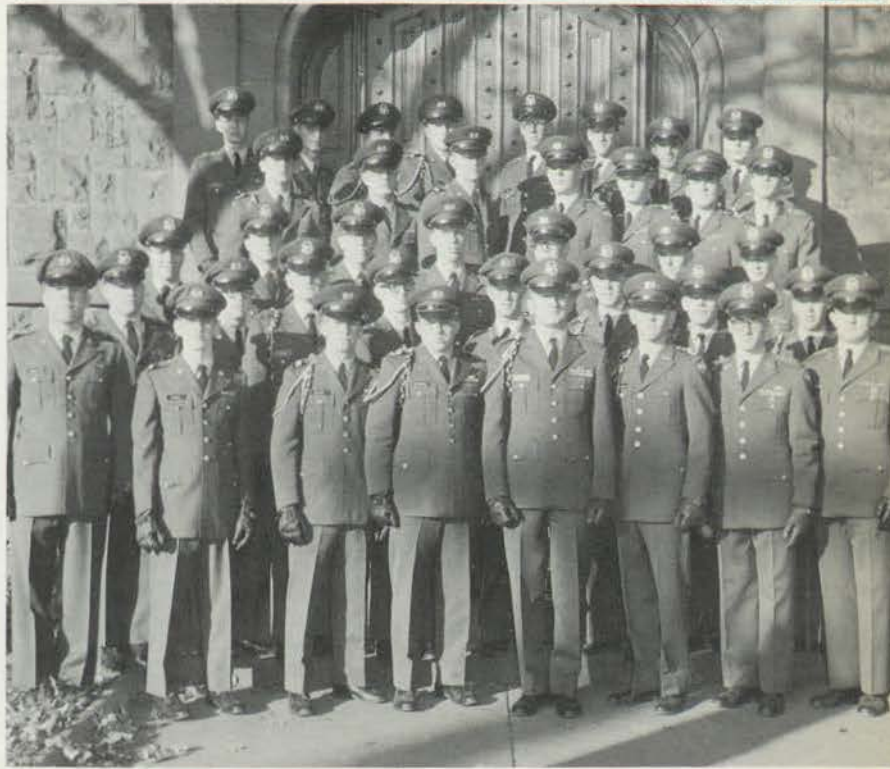

While the '62 mark proved disappointing to many, consolation can be derived from the team's brilliant play against the top colleges in the division. The Devils' failure on at least three occasions to score from the opponent's one-yard line turned what may well have been a 6-2 year into a 3-5 one.

Seibert did an outstanding job in keeping his talent thin squad on the threshold of victory throughout the season.

Dickinson opened the season against Swarthmore at Biddle Field. Trailing 7-0 with a minute and a half left in the game and the ball on its own ten, the home team thrilled the crowd by driving the length of the field on two passes from DiOrio to Dan Shaver and then scoring from the seven on a DiOrio to Zuyus aerial. Gambling for two points and a win, DiOrio's pass fell incomplete, and the visitors triumphed 7-6.

The following Saturday Dickinson crushed Haverford on Biddle Field by a 26-0 margin. John Harper booted a pair of field goals, and Warden DiOrio, and junior Bill Penney scored the touchdowns.

The Devils whipped F. & M. at Lancaster the following Saturday. It was the second straight Dickinson victory in a series that has been predominantly Blue for so many years. Shaver scored twice and Penney once for Dickinson. The visitors' first score came on an 86 yard pass from DiOrio to Shaver, which set a Dickinson College record.

Trailing 15-0 at the half against a powerful P.M.C. team, Dickinson fought back on the strength of Walt Buckley's passing. With a huge P.M.C. crowd watching in agony Buckley passed to Glenn Hitchens for the Devils' lone score and had the Devils on the move again when time ran out. The final score read P.M.C. 15 Dickinson 8.

The most discouraging game of the year took place on Biddle Field the next Saturday. Leading Lebanon Valley at the half 10-3, the Devils lost in the fourth period by a 15-10 count. Penney scored for Dickinson and Harper kicked his third field goal of the year and fifth in his career to establish a new Dickinson high.

Dickinson lost its third straight to Western Maryland 16-0 in a driving snowstorm that seemed to center around Carlisle. DiOrio and Penney ran well in this chilly contest.

DiOrio and Penney supplied the scoring punch the next week at Johns Hopkins when the Red and White beat the Blue Jays 14-0. Penney went over from the one and DiOrio bootlegged home from the 16 for the Devils' touchdowns.





Dickinson played one of its roughest games against Drexel in Philadelphia the next week but lost to the title-bound Dragons 10-7. Dan Shaver raced 34 yards for the lone Dickinson score. Halfback Dick Warden had an excellent day for the Devils.

Reno DiOrio was the Devil's outstanding player. The 180 pound captain led the Mid-Atlantic Southern Division in total offense. He was selected All-Conference quarterback and Most Valuable Player in the Conference.

Millard Shoff was voted Dickinson's Most Valuable Lineman. DiOrio was the Most Valuable Back.

Also excellent in the line was tackle Al Creps whose spirit and hustle bolstered the inner defense.

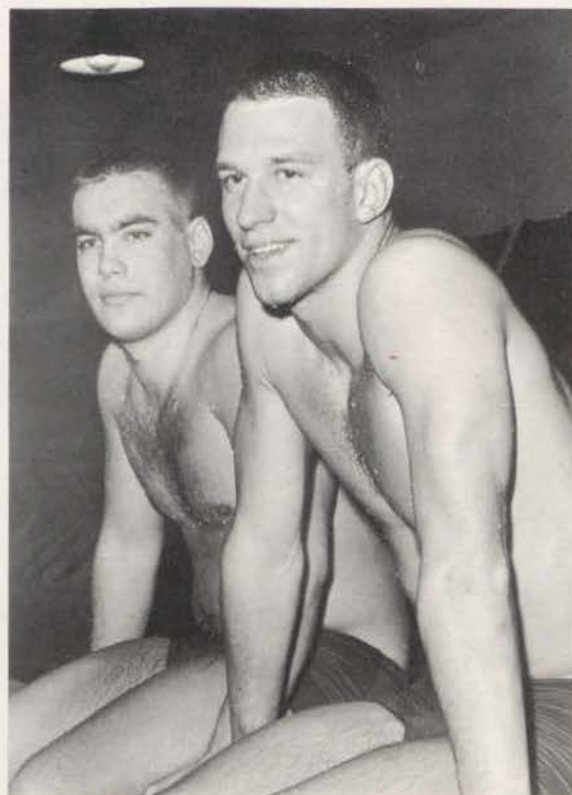

Dear Dickinsonians,

As shy and timid collegiate neophytes, we presented ourselves to Dickinson four years ago to be molded, shaped and prepared to meet the challenge which faces us this year. For our graduation day marks not only the culmination of an instructive, sometimes frustrating and truly rewarding collegiate experience, but also our induction into a world of complexity and intrigue.

At the outset a college career was to us a mere mystery and a question. Today the mystery is solved and the question answered. For the student who has learned to appreciate the experience of scholarly discipline, to think critically and rationally, in considering his own values and those of mankind, and to examine and search his very mind and soul in order to determine his philosophical position, his years at Dickinson have been valuable and rewarding ones. Unfortunately, most of us have yet to solve these paramount riddles. Fortunately, we have at least begun to think.

As seniors we have seen that life in a college community involves the interaction and cooperation of many devoted and sincere individuals. One's role as a student must be balanced by the diligence, scrutiny and attention of his mentors. The physical plant, too, is of considerable import in making his college career a truly worthwhile and enriching adventure.

Just as we have changed as individuals, Dickinson has changed—physically, academically, and socially during this four year interim. And it will continue to change drastically in the years ahead until the current envisioned development program is at last a reality.

The class of 1963 has witnessed the incipient stages of this transition. As we reminisce in the years ahead and review in retrospect our collegiate days, we must also recollect our moral duties and responsibilities to Dickinson College. Although the time has come for us to depart physically, we shall continue to grow, nurtured and disciplined through our interlude here. Dickinson, too, will continue to grow and mature. Instead of criticism and complaint, we must continue to offer willingly sustenance, support and nourishment to alma mater.

The present undergraduates face additional responsibilities, for they will continue to experience physically the state of flux in which the Dickinson of 1963 finds itself. The initial planning period has reached maximum acceleration. The challenge is left to each of us to strive for and to achieve full implementation of the proposals outlined for the "new Dickinson." We have been privileged to pursue a liberal arts education; our opportunity to reciprocate is truly at hand.
