ABSTRACT

This bibliography presents a modern definition of the conceptual framework from which to view natural resources, and affords access to information which examines resources from the social scientists point of view. It presents five broad divisions of activity or variables which include (1) Natural and Human Resources, (2) Epistemological and Scientific Resources, (3) Economic and Cultural Resources, (4) Attitudinal Directions, and (5) Selected Current Issues. It is international in scope, and provides access to information available in each division including research and writing in the field, statistical data, directories, research aids such as dictionaries and handbooks, and special reference works indicative of the state of the art in this decade. PREFACE

The basic compilation of this bibliography was done by Carola W. Forsythe during a Natural Resources Institute in the summer of 1966. Since that time the bibliography has been revised, edited and updated. This work was done under the auspices of the late Dr. Charles A. Dambach, Director, School of Natural Resources. Mrs. Irene B. Hoadley, The Ohio University Libraries, supervised the revision of the bibliography.

Extensive use has been made of a publication entitled, Science and Technology Literature; a Selected Bibliography of Sources, compiled by Robert W. Burns, Science Librarian at the University of Idaho (1964). Mr. Burns has done a remarkable job of annotating a large number of reference materials in science and technology; many of the citations included here are quoted directly from his bibliography and indicated by the notation: Bookmark.

DESIGN OF THE STUDY

ISSUES AND BASIC CONCEPTS

Introduction

If it were easy to define what a natural resource is, or with what analytic and statistical tools one describes such resources, there would be little need for an introduction except for purposes of mechanical explanation. If natural resources research were an acknowledged and accepted field of inquiry, there would be even less need for the discussion which follows. At present, however, neither of these conditions exists. Where resource consciousness does occur in institutional form, it is often partial; and thus our resource agencies, charged with the analysis and management of our resources in their physical contexts, must often give way to other demands from agencies and groups concerned primarily with social, political and economic activities.

The researcher will probably be surprised at some of the citations included in this bibliography. Those concerned with resource management have in the past tended to separate the "land" from the land-labor-capital or man-mind-land complex. As a rule, discussions on natural resources have been limited to categories such as: land and soils, minerals, forests, fish and wildlife, water and so forth, including the social context as an aside or afterthought. More recent philosophy and discussion give at least equal consideration to human resources and to the fields of ecology and planning. The discussion which follows elaborates the theoretical framework and rationale for this modern view of resource use, which says essentially that "resources are not; they become."¹ Further research, conducted with these basic issues in mind, should help us to rationalize our public policies and private decisions concerning the use and management of our resources.

Confusion Over Definition

Resources have sometimes been defined in circular fashion, that is, that fish and wildlife, plants and lands, water and air, minerals and fuels were resources, and that, therefore, resources were these things. This view was probably satisfactory for the ecological investigator. The social scientists and philosophers, however, introduced difficulties by attempting to circumscribe the concept of a resource, allowing for the inclusion of the above phenomena

but describing them in terms of their function. The "new theoretics" has been described as including "all the things and conditions in nature man can use to help meet his needs and aspirations."² It includes no less than the biologically and physically significant environment and man's actions in it.

An only slightly narrower definition would view the natural resources as part of three broad classes of resources, the other two being cultural and human. This is analogous to the trinity of land-labor-capital or man-mind-land. However, definitions and approaches vary. The most important point to be made is that a resource is a concept, and more, that the concept belongs essentially in the domain of the social sciences. The word itself implies the existence of an actor or agent. A plant may be a resource, but a resource is not automatically a plant.

Confusion Over Attitudes: Conservation Philosophies

The debates over conservation and resource scarcity, which have formed such a large part of our vocal history and those over resource scarcity and economic development which are now raging, lend direct support to the above statement. What one begins to understand from a brief historical survey is not the precise role of resources but, the role of value judgments in evaluating that role. Prophets of doom, coming from the ranks of scientists, public officials and concerned citizens, have told us to mend our ways before we consume the planet which provides us life. Others, including scientists but drawing mainly from industrialists, maintain that "technology" and "capital" substitute for "resources" and that as there is no end to man's ingenuity there is nothing to fear. Harold Barnett and Chandler Morse³ suggest that conservation writings may be divided into four main categories: philosophical naturalism, manifesting a metaphysical, often abstract concept of nature; conservation ethics, calling for wise management of our resources for the purposes of maintaining or creating a "good life;" conservation aesthetics, primarily a plea for the primacy of aesthetic values; and the ecological viewpoint, more analytic in nature but incorporating varieties of conservation values into the analysis.

The Place of Resources in Academic Analysis

The ecological analysis has led to further controversy, as between the pessimists and optimists noted above. The question of the optimum relation of man and his environment begs rigorous analysis. The issues under study are both practical and conceptual. There is increasing awareness of the possibilities of depletion of non-renewable resources in relation to total stock and the growth of population, but there is no assurance to what extent "technology" and "capital" may substitute for these resources. The pressures of population on the environment, of the earth's capacity to support human life is unknown; given the requirements of industrial growth, it is not known how distribution of population will enable us to derive maximum benefit from the natural universe. What time period that maximization should be attempted is not known. The philosophy of the conservationists has helped establish in our consciousness the need for such considerations. Their urgings for "wise use of natural resources" must be met with an analytical framework for deciding what is and what is not wise.

A small number of social scientists have turned their attention to problems of resource use. Among the demographers, notably Robert C. Cook, Irene Taeuber and C. B. Goodhart, the concern is, of course, the relation between resources and population. Political scientists Norman Wengert, Lyle Craine, Arthur Maass, Ernest Griffith, Luther Gulick and Robert Schultz are noted for their writings dealing with resource problems. Economists include Joseph Spengler, Edward Mason, John Isaacs, Ciriacy-Wantrup, Anthony Scott, John Kenneth Galbraith and a host of writers on problems of international economic development. The basic discipline for considering resource and social relationships is, of course, economic geography. However, there is still no organized body of knowledge which would derive from a theory explaining the interrelatedness of things:

Take two pieces of land of the same size and physical characteristics. One, which formed part of an open plain, is a natural resource. Another, which has been cleared of trees, is partly capital Renewable land can be increased by discovery, and by investment which makes no-rent land at the margin more accessible, and both can be decreased by intensive use and depletion If a natural resource is acquired as the result of extensive exploration, it may be regarded as capital.

A Conceptual Framework: Design of the Bibliography

Probably not much more discussion is needed to explain the wide range of materials included in this bibliography. When studying the land and the stream as resources, their function as agents for supplying human needs and men as agents of transforming the land is being studied. When one part is abstracted from the human-cultural-natural resources complex, it is only for the purpose of putting it back together in the proper relationship.

DESIGN OF THE BIBLIOGRAPHY

As emphasized above, resources are being examined from the social scientist's point of view. The rationale for compiling this bibliography was the lack of a comprehensive statement on just what constituted a resource and from whose point of view it should be analyzed. Section A, Contributions to the Field--Studies and Inventories, provides a survey of what some of these statements have been and what some of the research has included. It is hoped that the researcher will not only become familiar with these frames of thought but also develop his own exposition of complex relationships, both on small and large scales. One does not have to be a social scientist to use the concepts and methods of systems analysis.

The diagram which follows this section is one way of identifying what the elements of an overall system might be (note that in the present context, the word element means, simply, a part of a whole, the pieces which must be identified, the variables). The diagram is a series of wheels within wheels, whose relative positions are not intended to identify cause and effect, but rather to define a universe in which any set of resource processes may be located. In the center wheel are grouped those environmental phenomena which constitute the basic elements of economic activity, which serve as objects of scientific research and which must be managed by men to provide them with the biological, economic and cultural requisites of life. The categories chosen are, for the most part, common terms designating phenomena "used" by man in the twentieth century. Thus the composition of the class of resources called minerals has changed through history; the concept of air as a resource is only beginning to be recognized.

The second wheel serves the function of Erik Erikson's filter through which consciousness is determined, transformed and transforms. This includes the organization of scientific knowledge as well as cultural and economic patterns. The third wheel represents the translation of mental sets into action or the processes which become part of a resource system or congeries. The categories chosen are those used by the United Nations for presenting data on

economic activity* and may be further subdivided into 1,312 items according to the revised Standard International Trade Classification. The fourth circle, including only the two concepts of "conservation" and "development," represents additudinal directions in any process or system involving resource phenomena.

Some Mechanics

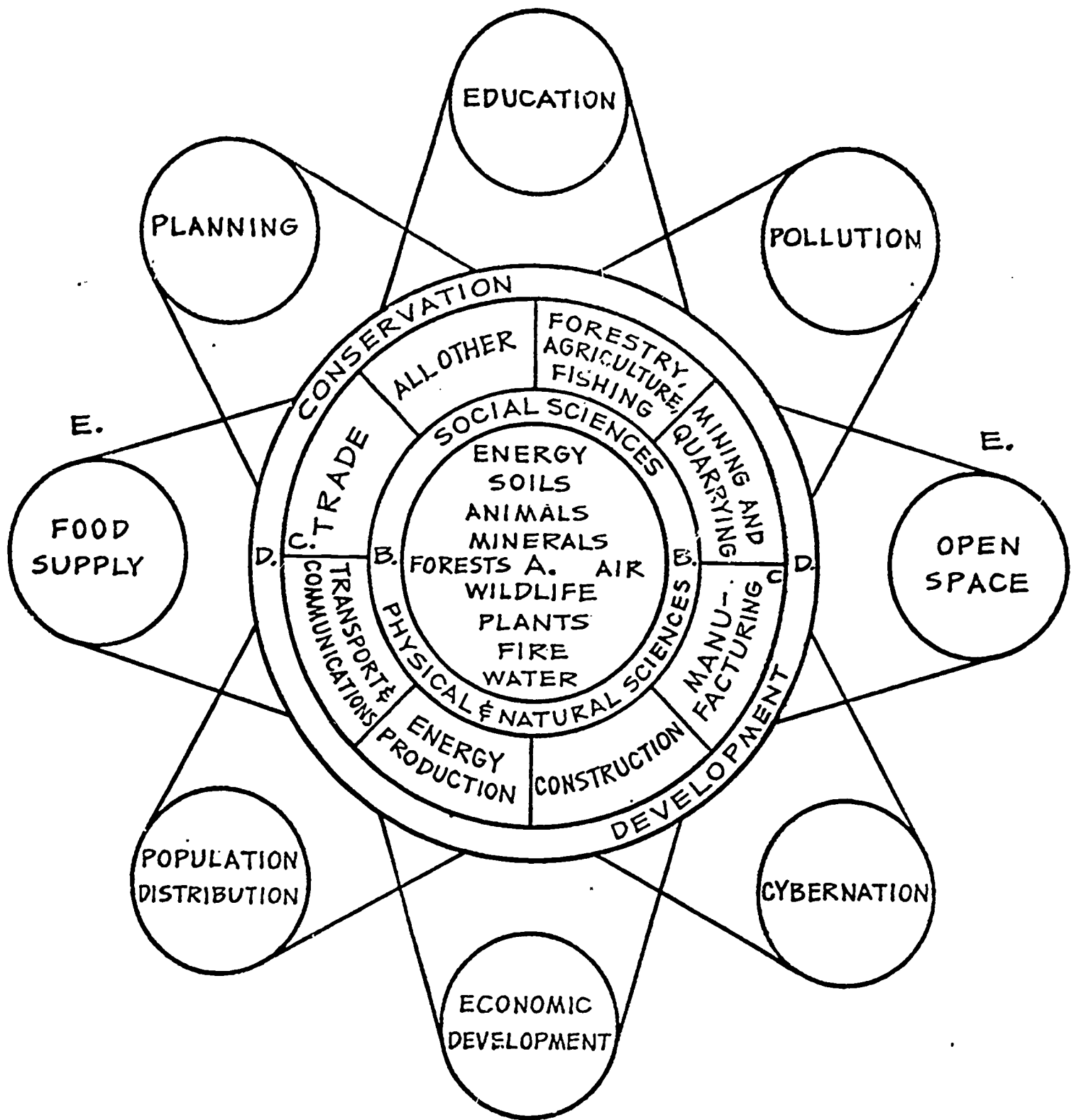
Within these concepts, the organization of the bibliography and the material included is intended to further scientific thinking by including as special cases under broader headings topics normally receiving prime attention in natural resources literature. Reference material has been categorized, wherever possible, according to its location on a continuum of research and its application, production, trade and consumption.

A glance at the table of contents will show that the pigeonholes provided by the wheel have not been followed exactly. The major divisions remain Science and Technology, Resources and The Economic, Political and Social Environment. However, resource phenomena are counted and accounted for in many different ways; thus forestry literature is placed in the Resources pigeonhole, but forest products statistics will be found in Part III on economic activities; literature on agronomy and related agricultural sciences is labeled "Resource," while commodity data, farm finance and production data, etc., will be found in Part III. In general, references in the Science and Technology section pertain directly to a discipline or vocation; the Resources section includes material of a scientific or technical nature dealing directly with the resource phenomenon--and usually from an interdisciplinary viewpoint; materials in the section dealing with the Economic, Political and Social Environment look at resources as they move in the productive processes as well as at some of the more general determinants of resource use, such as finance and capital flows, industrial and transportation processes. Some sources, of course, often contain both technical and economic information. In such cases, material has been assigned to one or another category on the basis of the concentration of its application to one or another field. A brief note at the beginning of each section will indicate where the student should look for further information on his topic. The subject index is intended to be an indicative rather than a comprehensive guide. The longer sections have been indexed more thoroughly than shorter ones. It is expected that the student will find a generalized "key word" in the index which will lead him to the specific information by process of inspection. A title index is also provided for quick reference.

The bibliography is not intended to meet the needs of every particularized research interest. The attempt has been, rather, to provide access to the information available in each category, including research and writing in the field, statistical data, directories, research aids such as dictionaries and handbooks and special reference works indicative of the "state of the art" in this decade. The former two types of literature represent continuing sources of information; the latter two categories include material which will undoubtedly be obsolete within a few years. The scope of the study is international. The material included, however, is intended to provide access to, rather than to expose for each country the detailed information available for the United States.

SECTION A
CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE FIELD

Theoretical Statements

Current writers who address themselves, directly or indirectly, to the scientific analysis of resource relationships and/or the public issues plaguing the twentieth century come from many fields. A sampling of this literature is presented below.

- A-1 American Institute of Planners Journal. (American Institute of Planners). Washington, D. C., 1925- . Quarterly.

This is a journal of commentary and research which addresses itself to the broad range of problems with which planners are concerned.

- A-2 Basic Concepts of Ecology. Clifford B. Knight. New York, The MacMillan Co., 1965.

The text is concerned with a wide range of basic principles of modern ecology, discussing history, the limiting factors of stratification and zonation, abiotic and biotic factors, climatology, the food factor, population and community ecology, ecological succession, the basic environments--aquatic and terrestrial areas, statistical procedures, radiation, pesticides, pollution, water, and oceans.

- A-3 The Challenge of Man's Future. Harrison Brown. New York, Viking Press, 1954.

An especially stimulating volume for the layman, including a brief overview of man's emergence and the issues of his use of world resources--energy, food, etc.--in the context of a growing world population.

- A-4 The Concepts of Conservation (A Guide to Discussion). Conservation Foundation. New York, 1956.

- A-5 Conservation of Natural Resources. 3rd edition. Guy Harold-Smith, New York, John Wiley and Sons, Inc., 1965.

One of the most recent examples of textbook materials, presenting a naturalist orientation through several chapters exploring aspects of the physical environment, but also including chapters on planning at national, state, and local levels.

- A-6 The Conservation Yearbook, A Directory and Guide to the Conservation of Renewable Natural Resources and to the Conservation Agencies and Organization. Baltimore, Maryland, Monumental Printing Co., 1962. New edition in progress.

This publication describes governmental and private agencies, including their functions, personnel, operations, publications, and so forth. Material is divided into the categories of: land and water resources; forests and forest products; national forests, state forestry, forest fire protection, forest planting; wildlife; national land reserve; reclamation; wilderness; parks, education; and conservation publications.

- A-7 The Human Use of the Earth. Philip Wagner. New York, Free Press of Glencoe, 1960.

Essentially a typology, or taxonomy, of the concepts with which we may study the social and physical aspects of man and environment. The major questions specifically dealt with are: "What are the relationships between the human body, as a system, and the conditions of its environment, both natural and artificial?" and at greater length, "What are the relations between different types of artificial environments as systems, and their natural and societal environments?"

- A-8 Introduction to World Resources. Henry L. Hunker, editor. New York, Harper and Row, 1964.

Henry Hunker, professor of geography at the Ohio State University, has edited the first ten chapters of Erich W. Zimmerman's World Resources and Industries, which first appeared in 1933. The major elements of Zimmerman's functional theory of resources, i.e., that "resources are not; they become," are presented in this stimulating book.

- A-9 Man and Nature. George Perkins Marsh. Cambridge, Mass., Belknap Press, 1965.

The work was originally published in 1864. Appearing at the peak of confidence in the inexhaustibility of American resources, it was the first book to controvert the myth of superabundance and spell out the need for reform. It was supposed to be, in the words of Marsh, "a little volume showing that whereas others think that the earth made man, man in fact made the earth." There are only minor alterations of the original work.

- A-10 Man, Mind and Land, A Theory of Resource Use. Walter Firey. New York, Free Press of Glencoe, 1960.

Firey attempts to develop a game theoretic, or logical framework for the discussion of problems of resource use and conservation in terms of the ecological, ethnographic, and economic elements of any given problem. He demonstrates how such a framework might be used in three case studies involving agricultural resource processes and systems.

- A-11 Man's Role in Changing the Face of the Earth. William L. Thomas, Jr., editor. Chicago, Chicago University Press, 1956.

This volume, sponsored by the Wennergren Foundation for Anthropological Research and the National Science Foundation, includes the papers of 70 participants in an international symposium of the above title. The issues which concerned this conference involve both history and process of climates, soils, biotic communities, ecology of wastes, seas and waters, urban-industrial demands, and prospects for the future.

- A-12 Natural Resources and International Development. Marion Clawson, editor. Baltimore, Johns Hopkins Press for Resources for the Future, 1964.

Explores the role of resources in economic development and international trade and in our traditional approaches to analyzing these problems. The articles discuss resource commodities of international significance--agriculture, petroleum, food, and fisheries--and regional problems and relationships in the Soviet economy, Western Europe, African countries, and Latin America.

- A-13 Natural Resources and the Political Struggle. Norman Wengert. New York, Doubleday, 1955.

A basic premise of this study is the pluralistic character of decision-making. Wengert surveys some of the major personalities and conflicts which form a part of our resource heritage as we have searched to define the public interest.

- A-14 A New Approach to Economic Geography. Jahar Lal Guha and Prabhas Ranjam. Calcutta, India, World Press Private, Ltd., 1963.

The volume is divided into the following sections: The Study of Resources; Critical Study of the World's Manufacturing; World's Transport Facilities and Trade.

- A-15 Perspectives on Conservation. Henry Jarrett, editor. Baltimore, Johns Hopkins Press for Resources for the Future, 1958.

Essays on history, policies, organization, demands, and technology of resource use and management by many of the intellectual leaders in the field: John Kenneth Galbraith, Paul B. Sears, Robert S. Cook, Abel Wolman, Samuel T. Dana, Henry C. Hart, Ernest S. Griffith, Thomas B. Nolan, Edward S. Mason, Gilbert F. White, William Pincus, and others.

- A-16 The Population Crisis and the Use of World Resources. Stuart Mudd, editor. Bloomington, Indiana, Indiana University Press, for the World Academy of Arts and Sciences, 1964.

Articles by philosophers, physical and natural scientists, social scientists, discussing (a) the social and physical aspects of birth control and population growth, with economic and political examples; (b) biological research and possible action programs; and (c) to a lesser extent, the use of world resources.

- A-17 Quality of the Environment. Orris C. Herfindahl and Allen V. Kneese. Baltimore, Johns Hopkins Press for Resources for the Future, 1965.

The authors seek to "show the non-economist why economic reasoning is not only helpful but indispensable in the analysis of the problems" and to "give the economists some understanding of the intriguing non-economic substance of these problems."

- A-18 Resource Conservation. S. V. Ciriacy-Wantrup. Berkeley, California, University of California Press, 1952.

Among the first major contributions to the analysis of resource use and policies apart from judgements based on emotion and values. The study has become a standard reference text.

- A-19 Resources and the American Dream. Samuel Ordway, Jr. New York, Ronald Press, 1953.

This small book explores the problem of expanding industrial consumption of resources and the dangers of reaching the limit of these resources.

- A-20 Scarcity and Growth. The Economics of Natural Resource Availability. Harold J. Barnett and Chandler Morse. Baltimore, Johns Hopkins Press for Resources for the Future, 1963.

The authors explore the historical development of the scarcity hypothesis and apply modern methods of economic and econometric analysis to resource problems.

- A-21 Science and Resources; Prospects and Implications of Technological Advance. Henry Jarrett, editor. Baltimore, Johns Hopkins Press for Resources for the Future, 1959.

Essays on social and scientific aspects of technological developments.

- A-22 America's Needs and Resources. Twentieth Century Fund. New York, J. F. Dewhurst and Associates, 1955.

Survey covers consumption and capital requirements, government and foreign transactions, resources and capacities, and an introductory chapter on basic trends.

- A-23 Annotated Index of Aerial Photographic Coverage and Mapping of Topography and Natural Resources Undertaken in Latin American Member Countries of the OAS. Pan American Union. Washington, D. C., 1964.

Nine vols.: Vol. 1, Bolivia (1964); Vol. 2, Chile (1965); Vol. 3, Ecuador (1965); Vol. 4, Haiti (1964); Vol. 5, Paraguay (1964); Vol. 6, Peru (1965); Vol. 7, Dominican Republic (1964); Vol. 8, Uruguay (1964); Vol. 9, Venezuela (1964).

- A-24 Arid Lands, A Geographical Appraisal. E. S. Hills, editor. London, Methuen and Co., Ltd., 1966.

A geographical study of arid lands, including geology, meteorology, irrigation, and human cultural elements.

- A-25 Arid Zone Research. (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization). Paris, 1953- . Irregular.

A monograph series on all aspects of agriculture, land, and resource management in arid lands. The study started in 1948 with a proposal to UNESCO by the delegation of India that an international Institute of the Arid Zone be established. By 1950 an International Arid Zone Research Council had been established and reports commissioned. Publications cover hydrology, plant ecology, human and animal ecology, administrative and organizational programs. See especially The Future of Arid Lands, Gilbert F. White, editor, including papers and recommendations from the International Arid Lands Meetings (Publication No. 43, American Association for the Advancement of Science, Washington, D. C., 1956). This volume reports on a meeting of scientists from 17 countries and "as many disciplines." Papers presented include social as well as scientific approaches and include bibliographies.

- A-26 Conservation--In the People's Hands. American Association of School Administrators. New York, 1964.

This study, undertaken in 1962, surveys practices in and attitudes toward conservation in various parts of the United States, giving particular emphasis to the role, present and potential, played by education.

- A-27 Directory of Research Natural Areas on Federal Lands of the United States of America. United States Department of the Interior, Federal Committee on Research Natural Areas, 1968.

A list of over 300 federal land areas where natural processes predominate, and which may be used for research or education. Also includes a list of natural ecological types by representative plants and animals found in each area.

- A-28 God's Own Junkyard: The Planned Deterioration of America's Landscape. Peter Blake. New York, Holt, Rinehart and Winston, 1964.

A photographic survey of America's junkyards, with provocative text.

ATMOSPHERIC SCIENCES

The references included here are those which relate atmospheric conditions to resource problems, such as the influence of climatic conditions on agriculture and water resource activities. Complementary material will be found in sections of this bibliography dealing with climatology, climatic data, air pollution, environmental health, water resources, and hydrology.

Information systems developed through the American Meteorological Association and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration provide extensive coverage of American developments; the World Meteorological Organization, with one data center already established in North America and two planned--one in Australia and one in the U.S.S.R.--is moving toward a world-wide data gathering and information system.

Research in the atmospheric sciences which deals with the atmosphere as such will also be found by searching the literature of physics, space science and technology, aeronautics and astronautics (In this bibliography, see aeronautical engineering.). Recent developments in these fields--and in particular the Environmental Survey Satellites launched from Cape Kennedy during the beginning of 1966--have direct bearing on the above-mentioned resource problems.

IAA covers books, periodicals, and other such media usually considered to be "published" literature. Both IAA and STAR use identical subject categories and indexes. Together these two provide comprehensive access to the unclassified report and published literature of current significance to aerospace science and technology. STAR is arranged in two major sections. The first contains the bibliographic citations with

the abstracts and is arranged by appropriate subject categories. SECTION L
AGRICULTURAL AND LAND RESOURCES

The information and documentation system for agriculture as developed by the United States Department of Agriculture and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations is quite extensive. The FAO characterizes itself as a "world intelligence service on production, prices and trade that covers almost every commodity used to feed, clothe and house people throughout the world." --Catalog. A similar information system, although more technical than economic, is provided for countries of the British Commonwealth by the bureaus and three institutes which comprise the Commonwealth Agricultural Bureaux. Their abstracting and indexing services cover world literature. Information on agriculture and finance for any particular country or region may usually be found in the reports of the banking and credit institutions of the country concerned or of the appropriate regional organization (See Section Z.). Other sources of information are the reports of the Ford and Rockefeller Foundations (including the Agricultural Development Council) and colleges and universities and other institutions which have been funding and assisting agricultural programs in developing countries.

The present section concentrates on the physical and agronomic aspects of agriculture: information sources in agricultural economics are listed in Section R.

a note of warning: agricultural production data are collected in terms of cycles of activity; thus data will sometimes be historically or horizontally (as among different regions) inconsistent as to dates.

Water, Including Hydrology, and Sedimentation

Data on water resources are collected according to usage (withdrawal, flow, onsite demands, and demands for streamflow as such); to water user demands (the major users being municipal, thermal-electric power generation, manufacturing and irrigation). The Public Health Service has carried major responsibility for water quality surveillance from 1912 to May of 1966 (its functions in this field being assumed by the Department of the Interior); the Federal Power Commission collects statistics pertaining to thermal-electric power use; the Bureau of the Census collects industrial use statistics; the Army Corps of Engineers, Bureau of Reclamation, Tennessee Valley Authority, and other regional bodies publish most of the material on water resource development in their respective areas; the United States Geological Survey has also undertaken much of the geophysical and related research. The recent work of the Senate Select Committee on Water Resources, whose reports were published as a series of committee prints in 1960, organizes much valuable information from many sources. Print number one contains an extensive bibliography. Water Resources Research Centers, operating in each of the 50 states and in Puerto Rico since 1956-66, will provide additional sources of information.

Data on water resources simply do not exist for large portions of the world. Rather, data are collected by project, particularly in river basin development, and it is hoped that there will eventually have been enough projects to fill our gaps of knowledge. An effort was made toward international coordination of water resources information through the establishment of a Water Resources Development Center within the United Nations in 1964. To date, the Center has remained almost totally inactive. It is hoped that much will be accomplished during the present international Hydrological Decade and in related oceanographic research programs.

European information is fairly complete. The Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East has conducted a project by project water survey; the reports are available in their Water Resources Series. Fairly extensive surveys were also taken by the international commission sponsoring the development of the Mekong River Basin. The Arid Zone Research Series of UNESCO is the most comprehensive source of information on water-deficient areas.

SECTION N
MINERAL AND ENERGY RESOURCES

Minerals

Domestic and European literature is almost as abundant for minerals as it is for agriculture due to the key role which such materials play in industrial development and national security. Mineral resources become "capital" more readily and directly than most other resources. Much of the relevant information, therefore, will be available through organizations in engineering and industrial phases of production (See Section K. "Metallurgical Engineering," Section S. "Mining and Manufacturing."). Major United States sources of information on minerals and materials research at the primary stages are governmental, notably the Bureau of Mines, the Geological Survey, the Departments of Commerce and Defense. The mineral resources of much of the world remain unexplored (Note, however, the work of the Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East, available in its Mineral Resources Series.). In many cases minerals sources have been the property of American, Canadian and European firms: data on these economic enclaves would appear in the reports of particular firms and trade associations. As in the domestic context, other sources of data are the professional engineering and scientific societies, and study and trade organizations of particular commodities (copper, lead, tin, zinc) and industries (aluminum, iron and steel, etc.). Check the sections on science and technology, economic and social organization, earth sciences, energy production for guides to related research.

Policies and Finance

A general note on sources of information on government operations will have to be limited. References below provide the major sources: it is worth noting, however, that much domestic information on resources research will be found in Senate and House Committees on Government Operations, Public Works, Appropriations, Agriculture, Interior and Insular Affairs, etc.; through the Natural Resources Committee of the Federal Council for Science and Technology; through the National Academy of Sciences--National Research Council. State and local agencies abound, each with its own reports and publications.

Lacking in the material to follow is information on defense procurement activities. Tabulations of defense requirements are found with the Defense Materials System (DMS), the peacetime successor to the Controlled Materials Plan (CMP) of World War II and the Korean War. The tabulations cover only prime contractors and subcontractors at the end of product stage. Magnesium, lead, zinc, and other important minerals are omitted from the lists. Requirements of the Atomic Energy Commission are withheld; however, their procurement needs are small relative to total defense needs. Supplementary data may be found in census data on ships and aircraft, Bureau of Mines publications,

and reports of the Dow Chemical Company, Aerospace Industries Association (formerly Aircraft Industries Association), the American Ordnance Association, etc.

SECTION X

RECREATION

General Note

Information on recreation remains scattered, although the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation of the Department of the Interior is in the process of establishing a coordinating information retrieval system. The Bureau has initiated a periodic reporting service on major actions affecting outdoor recreation, natural beauty, and related conservation matters. The first issue appeared in August, 1966. The service is available from the Superintendent of Documents at \$1.50 per year. To meet particular interests, check masters' theses and doctoral dissertations, publications of the Small Business Administration, the Department of Agriculture (Cooperative Extension Service Economic Research Service, State extension stations, the Forest Service etc.) the Department of the Interior (Bureau of Land Management), Department of Health, Education and Welfare (particularly the Public Health Service), the Department of Commerce (Area Redevelopment Administration, now the Economic Development Administration), and publications of and concerning the Outdoor Recreation Resources Review Commission. Information will also be found in the Papers and Proceedings of the Regional Science Association, publications of Resources for the Future, and of private recreation and health associations.

For international and foreign information, check first the publications of the governments concerned, but also publications and statistical information available through UNESCO.
