 United States Court of Appeals, Ninth Circuit. | October 02, 1985 | 772 F.2d 1453 | 38 Fair Empl Prac.Cas. (BNA) 1850

Employee brought action claiming sex and age discrimination and violation of the Equal Pay Act. The United States District Court for the Northern District of California, William A. Ingram, J., granted employer's motion for summary judgment, and employee appealed. The Court of Appeals, Poole, Circuit Judge, held that: (1)...
