# Marion County Reentry Initiative Memorandum of Understanding

WHEREAS, under Oregon's community corrections system, counties are responsible for parole and probation, and in Marion County community corrections services are jointly governed by the three elected county commissioners and Marion County Sheriff through the Marion County Community Corrections Board; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 267 (2003) requires evidence-based practices for Oregon's corrections programs; whereby Marion County implements evidence-based risk assessments, case assignments, case planning, and staff training to achieve positive outcomes for prison diversion and reentry service participants; and

WHEREAS, more than 90% of prison inmates will return to our communities, with Marion County experiencing one of the highest per capita prison release rates of all Oregon counties; operating the fourth largest jail in Oregon; and supervising nearly 4,000 people on parole and probation; and

WHEREAS, through the Marion County Reentry Initiative, recidivism rates have dropped from 36% in 2002 to an all-time low of 14% in 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Marion County Reentry Initiative was recognized for an achievement award by the National Association of Counties; was one of seven sites selected by the U.S. Bureau of Justice Assistance to participate in a control-group evaluation study; and participated in a randomized controlled trial study by the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission; and

WHEREAS, through Oregon's Justice Reinvestment Initiative, Marion County is actively developing strategies to divert property and drug offenders from state prison through diversion programs, specialty courts, and downward departures;

NOW BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the parties to this Memorandum of Understanding support the goals, objectives, and organizational structure described in this agreement that further the Marion County Reentry Initiative's vision: Working together to rebuild lives, promote community safety and save taxpayers money by breaking the cycle of criminal activity; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the parties to this Memorandum of Understanding agree to work collaboratively to perform the following tasks during the duration of this agreement.

- A. Implement and refine services and programs (described in Exhibit C) for justice system clients.
- B. Ensure evidence-based or other quality standards in service delivery; including linking service delivery to client criminogenic risks and needs, thereby supporting the "Risk-Need-Responsivity" model.
- C. Use Community Data Link, the shared, common, web-based database, to capture client demographics, assessments, direct services, and referrals.
- D. Monitor client progress and analyze data over time, relevant to each organization's programs and services including, but not limited to: (1) Post-prison recidivism rates; (2) criminogenic risk scores; (3) levels of motivation; (4) program completion rates; (5) educational attainment; (6) employment rates; (7) housing stability; and (8) community support (i.e., volunteers, in-kind resources, funding).
- E. Track and report use of volunteers and leveraging of community resources.
- F. Increase community awareness and engagement regarding justice reinvestment issues and promote opportunities for individuals, businesses, faith-based organizations, and others to give people a second chance.
- G. Contribute to the initiative's sustainability, including selected parties serving as fiscal agents to secure and administer grant funds, as determined and agreed to by parties to this agreement through the reentry council, design team, or other authorized decision-making bodies.
- H. Adhere to professional standards of conduct, including professional ethics and client confidentiality.
- I. Share timely information about the initiative within and throughout each organization.
- J. Communicate relevant findings and raise pertinent issues with other parties to this agreement.

#### **TERMS OF AGREEMENT:**

This agreement shall commence upon signature, remain valid through June 30, 2021, and be eligible for renewal for successive five-year term. New organizations may be added through written amendment to this document. Upon 30-day written notice, a party may amend or dissolve its agreement to participate in this Memorandum of Understanding. Written notice shall be delivered to: Commander Jeff Wood, Marion County Parole and Probation Division, 4040 Aumsville Hwy. SE, Salem, OR 97317.

- 8. Coordinate program direction and implementation through monthly MCRI planning meetings, participation on workgroups, and meetings with staff representatives from provider organizations, faith-based organizations, businesses, and others.
