A quorum being present, the meeting was called to order at 6:02 p.m. by Board President Margo Ulmer.

Board Response:

Board of Education President Margo Ulmer responded to public comments as presented at the September 18, 2013 Board of Education Meeting. The topics and responses were as follows:

- Participation in Relay Recess during field day: Mrs. Ulmer indicated that partnering with the American Cancer Society and Relay Recess presented a great opportunity to align school activities to the district's mission of teaching empathy and compassion towards others.
- Defective fish in the Elementary School cafeteria: Mrs. Ulmer indicated that Elementary Principal Kristina Saucke has addressed the issue.
- Employment details of district personnel: Board President Ulmer indicated that the district will not comment on items that relate to personnel, but that the district works with the appropriate certifying agencies to ensure that compliance is maintained.
- Handrail in front of the new Elementary School steps: Mrs. Ulmer indicated that the engineers designed the steps in a way that there would be no need for handrail. Mrs. Ulmer then indicated that discussion on the hand rail has continued and that the district is working with architect, SEI

design and the Director of Facilities and Transportation, George English to create handrails in that area.

- Copying Expenses for Binder Materials: Mrs. Ulmer indicated that the district, wherever possible, has partnered with outside vendors to create savings for the district.
- Operation Santa: Mrs. Ward has fully explained reasons for changes over the past several months. Mrs. Ulmer indicated that the Board of Education has repeatedly assured those who have made inquiries that Operation Santa will prosper and continue to grow under the changes advised by the district's legal counsel and that previous advisors and students participants have been consulted to ensure a smooth transition so that the district can ensure that Operation Santa will grow and thrive for at least another 72 years.
- Comments by a Board of Education member that were perceived as disparaging to a teacher: Mrs. Ulmer stated the Board of Education has acknowledged the need for internal review and has identified and implemented operating protocol, indicating that it was never the intention to disregard the concerns of others and that the Board of Education affirms they have no tolerance for disrespect towards others. Mrs. Ulmer apologized on behalf of the Board of Education for any perceived improprieties and assured staff that they will be treated with respect when they come before the Board of Education. Mrs. Ulmer indicated that the Board's primary responsibility is to create policy, that it is the Superintendent's job to implement policy and the Board of Education is ready to move on.

Points of Interest:

Board Member Mona Sage-Cardinale indicated that the Community Garden is having a work party on Saturday, October 5th, 2013 and all volunteers are welcome to join.

Superintendent Kimberle Ward commented on the Naples Grape Festival, indicating that the Grape Festival was a huge success; the weather was great; there were record crowds Saturday; and that the Rotary Wine Tent did great. Mrs. Ward noted that a major highlight was the front lawn and that student fundraisers went over very well, most notably the senior class grilling grapes with various toppings. Mrs. Ward stated that all in all, it was a good weekend that does a lot for the Naples community and the school community.

Superintendent Recognitions & Updates

Superintendent Ward welcomed back the Junior/Senior High School Staff. Superintendent Ward and High School Principal Matthew Frahm introduced the new School Psychologist Melissa Steenburgh indicating that Ms. Steenburgh rose to the top of the candidate pool during the interview process, noting Ms. Steenburgh will be addressing testing and Committee on Special Education needs, adding that Ms. Steenburgh is upbeat, optimistic, and great with kids. Ms. Steenburgh indicated that she loves the area and the community, and is looking forward to making a difference for students and staff. Mrs. Ward indicated that the start of school went smoothly and thanked the staff for their continued flexibility given the ongoing capital project.

Kurt Vater and Victor Tomaselli from SEI Design Group and Todd LaBarr from Watchdog Building Partners presented that capital project update, noting that the exterior precast is being installed, interior drywall, mechanical, electrical, block work, and plumbing are progressing quickly, that the level of craftsmanship is very high, and the pool gunnite and gutters are complete. The Board of Education and public toured the project at 6:19 p.m. and returned at 7:02 p.m. Mrs. Ward and Mr. Frahm introduced Foreign Exchange students Pablo Gutierrez from Mexico and Vincent Emrich from Germany. Mr. Emrich indicated that he is pleased with the many class options, the school lunch and the high school principal, but that he is not used to the lack of longer breaks during the school day. Mr. Gutierrez indicated that the teachers and students are great and that he wishes he had more time between class periods.

Mr. Jeff Liebentritt presented the grades 5 & 6 department chair report noting that there has been great change with the implementation of the Common Core Curriculum. Mr. Liebentritt indicated that although the changes have been overwhelming and time consuming, the staff has embraced the Common Core and teachers are working hard to master the curriculum. Mr. Liebentritt indicated an additional challenge exists when a teacher instructs over multiple grade levels thusly having to master modules over multiple grade levels. Mr. Liebentritt noted the new student management system, School Tool, AIMS Web for assessments, and projects like Get Up, Fuel Up create additional time requirements for teachers, but that the recent purchase of technology in the form of I-Pad's has helped improve instruction. Mrs. Ward and Mr. Liebentritt responded to a period of questions from Board members regarding the details discussed above.

Regular Meeting

Superintendent Ward discussed the Relay for Life Celebration that she and Mr. Frahm attended. At the celebration, it was stated that the event raised \$21,186 and that the organization is looking for feedback to plan and improve next year's Relay for Life event. Superintendent Ward indicated that she put out a survey to elicit feedback.

Superintendent Ward and Director of Pupil Personnel Services, Alan Moore discussed the Quality Improvement Plan for programs for students with disabilities. Mrs. Ward noted that in Naples, students scored zero for proficiency in both Math and English Language Arts. Mr. Moore stated that he is working with Donna Brooks from BOCES to help improve test scores, adding that Ms. Brooks will assist the district in observing classrooms, compiling data, analyzing data, and coming up with an action plan with the help of a district committee that will meet on October 17th. Mr. Moore stated the action plan will look at needed professional development, training, intervention services, and classroom instruction in an effort to be successful with the Common Core Curriculum.

Board President Margo and Board Member Gail Musnicki discussed the Leadership Seminar that was held by the New York State School Boards Association, noting the sessions included Mediating Conflict and Managing Relationships, Making Sense of the Common Core, and Evaluating Your Superintendents. Mrs. Ulmer indicated that many districts do a self-reflection/self-evaluation annually or quarterly to assess their effectiveness and suggested that the Board of Education consider doing this in the future.
