Sunday, October 2, 2022 Prayer Service at 2:00 p.m. Life Chain from 2:30-3:30 p.m.



uring the planning study for the *Building in Faith for Future Generations* Capital Campaign, our parishioners, school and religious education families asked good questions regarding the Questions and Answers will help keep you better informed about our projects, the campaign and the future of St. Petronille Parish – and we will share more in the weekly bulletins leading up to Kickoff Weekend in mid-October:

Why is now the best time for a capital campaign?

There are two main reasons we are launching a capital campaign now. First, we know from our master campus assessment that these critical maintenance and modernization projects must be completed soon so that the condition of our buildings doesn't deteriorate any further. Second, there was overwhelming support for this campaign from you, our parish, school and religious education families, when asked in the planning study this past winter.

Doesn't the parish have savings that we can use for these projects, or can't we have special collections to raise the money?

No, the parish does not have savings to pay for these projects, and no, special collections will not raise the funds needed to accomplish our goals. St. Petronille has not had a capital campaign in over 20 years, which means for two decades, repairs and maintenance have happened on case-by-case bases, most having reasonable costs.

An example of a project that couldn't be paid from savings: the north side retaining wall. The north side retaining wall cost over \$400,000 to fix. Because of the timeliness to repair, St. Petronille had to ask the Diocese for a loan to address the wall. The proposed repair and maintenance projects are similar to the wall, expensive. Collectively, the repairs and needed upgrades cost in the millions of dollars. To raise this amount, we need a capital campaign effort.

I'm hearing about "phases" for this capital campaign. Please explain these "phases".

The parish enlisted engineering and architectural firms to assess the campus buildings back in 2019. At that time, 19 years had passed since St. Petronille had really examined the state of its facilities. Fr. Milota and the parish leadership councils reviewed the assessments and drafted a master plan for the parish—church, school, religious education—for the next 10-15 years.

The "phases" you hear about are three proposed segments in which the projects in the master plan would be accomplished. The *Building in Faith for Future Generations* Capital Campaign is addressing the first segment, representing the most pressing, most urgent, critical maintenance needs of the parish. Phases 2 and 3 address future projects and plans, but St. Petronille cannot move ahead without completing the needs in Phase 1.


