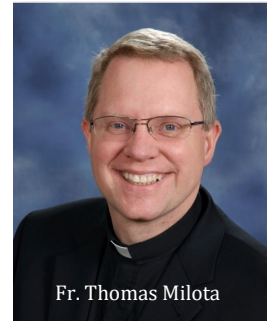

Independence Day

We celebrate the signing of the Declaration of Independence on July 4th:

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. - -That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, --That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security...

When my forebear, James Smith, signed this document, he could not have foreseen where this providential act would lead. He was only one of 8 immigrants to sign the document being a Pennsylvania Presbyterian originally from Ireland. I wonder what he would think of his descendant being a Catholic priest, but, then again, his confrere, Charles Carroll was the only Catholic signing the document and one of the wealthiest men in the 13 colonies. Oh...by the way, Charles was the longest-lived of the signers and His cousin, John Carroll, became the first Catholic bishop in the United States.

We can still learn from their example: operating on principle as well as being faithful, courageous, and studious.

Let us remember all those who serve the causes of true freedom, freedom of religion without fear, freedom to speak, freedom to live, freedom to seek happiness. We remember those who fought, those who fought and died and those who led even when it wasn't popular.

May Almighty God bless you and yours this Independence Day.

Eucharistic Adoration Every Friday

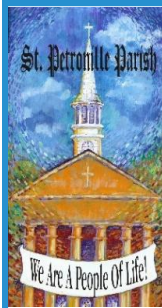


We have the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the Church every Friday from 3 -10pm, 24-hour Adoration on First Fridays following the 8am Mass
